During a two-week frenzy midway through the 1988 season, the Nashville Sounds went through an unthinkable five different managers.

Jack Lind (1), who opened the season as the Sounds' skipper, left the club due to health problems. Pitching coach **Wayne Garland** (2) filled in on an interim basis in Lind's absence until former manager **George Scherger** (3) -- who piloted the 1979 Southern League championship club in Nashville -- was brought back on board by the Cincinnati Reds brass.

*Scherger retired after only one game at the helm (a 3-2 loss). **Jim Hoff** (4) replaced Scherger for a brief time before quickly departing for a Reds front office post. Finally, former Texas Rangers skipper **Frank Lucchesi** (5) was brought on to guide the Nashville club for the remainder of the season.*

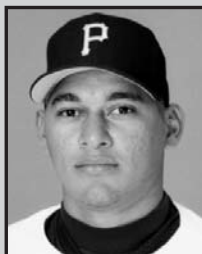

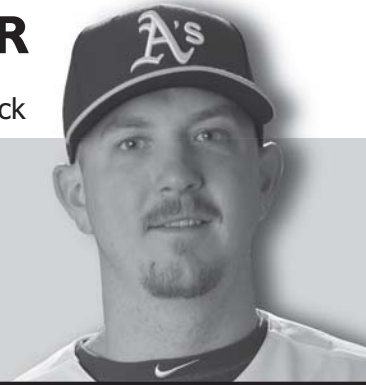

Sounds right-hander Chris Hammond took the pitching Triple Crown in the American Association during the 1990 season. Hammond led the league with 15 wins, a 2.17 ERA, and 149 K's, and was named the AA Pitcher-of-the-Year. Entering the 2014 season, no other Nashville hurler has led the league in more than one of those categories in the same season.

Hammond's ERA mark remains the Sounds' single-season record. Following his two-year Sounds career, he made his major league debut with Cincinnati the following season and went on to record several "franchise firsts" as a member of the 1993 Florida Marlins.
