RAILRIDERS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 29-15 | AWAY: 30-19 | STREAK: W 4 | LAST 5: 4-1 | LAST 10: 8-2

LAST TIME OUT: The RailRiders' domination of the Buffalo Bisons continued on Sunday afternoon with a 5-0 blanking at Coca-Cola Field. The RailRiders have won 10 of their last 12 overall and 26 of 36, while the Bisons have lost 33 of their last 40 along with 12 straight versus SWB. Going back to last season, the RailRiders have won 27 of the last 33 head-to-head meetings with the Bisons.

WHY SO SERIEOUS?: The 2017 RailRiders lost their first five games against Buffalo before ripping off 12 straight wins, outscoring Buffalo over the 12 triumphs, 53-11. With just three more head-to-head meetings remaining, SWB has clinched the regular-season series with its division rival. The RailRiders have not posted a losing mark to the Bisons since the 2014 unit went 7-9.

B-MAC: Billy McKinney doubled and scored on a 1-for-4 Saturday night. In his 13 Triple-A affairs, he has gone 18-for-51 with eight extra-base hits (four homers), nine RBIs, 10 runs scored and an outfield assist, slashing .353/.389/.686/1.075. McKinney has more three-hit games (3) than hitless games (2) at Triple-A.

I'M JUST A CAVE MAN: Jake Cave went 2-for-4 with a run scored and has hit safely in 12 of his last 14 games. He finished 3-for-3 and recorded his first career two-homer game on July 8 versus Lehigh Valley with a career-best five RBIs. The MVP of the Governors' Cup Championship Series in 2016, Cave has gone 32-for-100 with SWB, posting 13 extra-base hits (seven home runs), 16 RBIs and 19 runs scored while slashing .320/.376/.600/.976. Cave entered 2017 with 19 career round-trippers. He has 12 between Double-A Trenton (5) and SWB this year.

SOL MAN: Donovan Solano ended May hitting .164 overall. Since the start of June, he has reached safely in 32 of his 38 games played and owns a .313/.357/.403/.759 line in that time. During the spurt he has 10 doubles and 16 RBIs, lifting his average by nearly 100 points to .263. He began the Buffalo series with a 2-for-4 game, but went 0-for-13 in the final three affairs.

SWIPER, NO SWIPING!: SWB leads the IL in caught-stealing efficiency at 44% (33 of 75 caught). Eddy Rodriguez stands as the IL's top catcher in the category. With Rodriguez behind the plate, SWB has nabbed 20 men in 38 attempts (53%). The IL's average caught-stealing efficiency minus SWB stands at 32%. No IL catcher has finished a season with a better caught-stealing rate since Rochester's Corky Miller ended the 2005 season at an IL-best 62%. At the time, a catcher needed just 10 attempts against to qualify and he nabbed 16 in 26 tries. The standard was changed to catching at least 50% of the team's total number of games in 2007.

T-WADE: Playing his first game in a week and his first at Triple-A in three weeks, Tyler Wade went 2-for-5 with a double, two runs scored and his Triple-A best 25th stolen base. Despite his long absence while in the bigs, Wade remains among the IL leaders in multiple categories: AVG (2nd, .315), OBP (2nd, .390) R (2nd, 61).

OFF THE RAILS: SWB's offense ranks among the IL's best in: R/G (1st, 4.89), AVG (1st, .273), OBP (1st, .339), SLG (1st, .444), OPS (1st, .783), 2B (1st, 194), 3B (1st, 27), HR (3rd, 96) and SB (3rd, 78)...SWB pitching ranks among the IL's best in ERA (2nd, 3.37), WHIP (1st, 1.19) and K/9IP (2nd, 9.0)...SWB is undefeated in extra-inning games (6-0)...Only Columbus (7-0) has a better mark in the IL...At 16-6 (.727), the RailRiders boast the IL's best record in one-run games...No IL team has more wins when trailing after seven (6) or eight innings (4) than the RailRiders...SWB is the IL's only team undefeated when leading after seven frames (49-0) and one of five squads with unblemished records when in command after eight innings (45-0)...The RailRiders have lost a series just once since dropping two of three in Pawtucket from May 8-10...The RailRiders have won a season-high six straight road games and boast the IL's best road record at 30-19 (.612)...Rob Refsnyder homered on a 3-for-4 day with a sac fly...Miguel Andujar went 2-for-4 with a sac fly...He has hit safely in six straight games, lifting his Triple-A average by 45 points from .255-.299...Cito Culver snapped an 0-for-21 funk with a pair of hits including a double...Jonathan Diaz reached base three times, going 1-for-2 with two walks and a run scored against his former club...Buffalo has lost 33 of its last 40 games and has been held to one run or less in 19 of those setbacks including eight shutouts...SWB has held Buffalo to one run or less in eight of the last nine head-to-head match-ups...The RailRiders recorded their 11th shutout win of the year while Buffalo endured its league-worst 13th shutout loss...SWB has played a season-high-tying four straight error-free games...With a win tonight, the RailRiders would claim their 60th win in their 94th game...The 2016 Triple-A National Championship team registered its 60th win in its 96th game.

ON THE BUMP: Signed by NYY as a non-drafted FA on Dec. 19, '13, Adonis Rosa makes his second spot start for SWB. His won his first on June 17 at BUF in G2 of a DH (6IP, 6H, 0R, 0BB, 4K, 79P/51S). SWB blanked the Bisons in that 7-inn. game, 4-0. Rosa has spent the rest of '17 at Low-A (18G/5GS, 3-2-2/2, 3.46, .257, 1.12, 9BB in 65 IP for 1.25 BB/9IP). While he has not started since his June 17 fill-in nod for SWB, he comes off a long "relief" win at Hagerstown July 12 (7IP, 4H, 0R, 1BB, 8K). He has worked behind Austin DeCarri in each of his last three Low-A outings. Including his prior SWB nod, over his last 6 app.: 3-0, 1.37, .267, 1.14.

Signed by NYM as an int'l FA in Nov. '09, Gabriel Ynoa rose as one of NYM's top prospects. An All-Star in '12 (SS-A/NYP), '13 (Low-A/SAL, POY) and '16 (AAA/PCL), he won his MLB debut with a perfect 11th vs. SD on Aug. 13, '16. He spent most of Aug. '16 on in MLB w/10G/3GS, 1-0, 6.38, .333, 1.80. On Feb. 10, '17 NYM traded him to BAL for cash. He struggled in his '17 debut w/NOR at CHA (2.2IP, 10H, 7R/5ER, 1BB, 2K - Loss). His lone NOR win is his only NOR QS, vs. SYR Apr. 29 (6.1IP, 6H, 2R, 1BB, 4K, 1HR). He also has 4G/0GS w/BAL in '17: 1-0, 4.26, .321, 1.50. He won his BAL debut vs. CWS May 5 (6IP, 6H, 0R, 0BB, 5K).

Roll Tides

TEAM HISTORY: The Tides were an A-ball team from 1961-68, spending time in both the South Atlantic League (1961-62) and the Carolina League (1963-1968) before shifting to the Triple-A level from 1969 through today. Over time, the Tides have been affiliated with the then-Kansas City A's, St. Louis Cardinals, Chicago White Sox, Philadelphia Phillies and a lengthy relationship with the New York Mets (1969-06) until falling under the Orioles' umbrella in 2007. The team has been called the Portsmouth-Norfolk Tides, Tidewater Tides and Norfolk Tides while playing in three different ballparks including Lawrence Stadium (1961-68), Met Park (1969-92) and today's Harbor Park (1993-Present).

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS: Norfolk has played for the IL title nine times and has claimed the Governors' Cup five times. It won the International League crown in 1972 and 1975 along with a three-peat from 1982-85. It fell short in the finals in 1971, back-to-back times from 1987-88, and in 1995.

THE SKIPPER: Ron Johnson is in his sixth year as the Tides' manager. He took the gig after spending a dozen years with the Boston Red Sox including two seasons as the big club's first-base coach (2010-11). In 2012, Norfolk went 74-70 under his tutelage for the franchise's best showing since 2005. The Tides did so while setting an IL record by using 75 players. A record SWB tied in 2015. In Johnson's second season, the Tides went 77-67 and lost out on a playoff spot due to the head-to-head tiebreaker with Rochester. The Tides finished third in the South at 65-79 in 2014, but won the division at 78-66 in 2015. The 2016 Tides went 62-82, finishing last in the IL South and just a half-game in front of Syracuse to avoid the outright worst record in the league. Johnson's family endured grief when his daughter, Bridget, lost her leg and nearly died almost six years ago. On Aug. 1, 2010, she attempted to cross a road in Morrison, Tenn. atop her horse, Rhonda, according to *HamptonRoads.com*, when a car crashed into them and severed her leg. She spent more than a month in the hospital while enduring double-digit surgeries. She now wears an artificial leg. The incident drew donations from a variety of places, including several members of the New York Yankees. The Bombers' then-hitting coach, Kevin Long, championed the Yankees' contributions. Johnson managed Long in the minors and helped get him his first coaching job with the Kansas City Royals. Long, who served as the Yankees' hitting coach from 2007-14, is in his second season with the New York Mets in the same role. His son, Jaron Long, spent time with the 2015 RailRiders and was one of the team's IL-record-tying 24 different starting pitchers.
