RAILRIDERS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 37-20 | AWAY: 37-21 | STREAK: W 5 | LAST 5: 5-0 | LAST 10: 8-2

LAST TIME OUT: The SWB RailRiders rode a pair of two-run home runs and some dominant pitching to a 7-2 thumping of the host Gwinnett Braves on Tuesday night. The RailRiders have won nine straight games at Coolray Field including last year's playoff series against the G-Braves.

MAC ATTACK: Billy McKinney doubled and scored Monday night. On July 31 he was named the IL Batter of the Week for July 24-31 after hitting .440. He led the league over the week in extra-base hits (6), runs batted in (9), and slugging percentage (.920). In 32 games as a RailRider he has gone 43-for-123 with nine doubles, three triples, nine homers and 26 RBIs, slashing .350/.386/.691/1.077.

I'M JUST A CAVE MAN: Jake Cave doubled and drove in a run last night. He was named the IL's Player of the Month for July on Aug. 1 after hitting safely in 24 of 26 games and carrying a .390 average. Cave saw the IL's longest hitting streak of the season come to a close at 19 games after going 0-for-4 on Saturday. He hit .440 (.33-for-75) over his run. Cave also lost the circuit's best home-field hitting streak of the year at 24 games. He hit .429 (39-for-91) during his surge at PNC Field. The MVP of last year's Governors' Cup Championship Series entered 2017 with 19 career round-trippers. He has 18 between Double-A Trenton (5) and SWB this year, one off the pace of Mike Ford (19) for the highest sum on the Yankees' farm. Cave had a .399 career slugging percentage entering 2017. **Between Double-A and Triple-A this season, Cave's .600 slugging percentage stands sixth in all of full-season MiLB.**

CAN DO: Miguel Andujar singled and scored last night. He closed Saturday's game 0-for-4 as the IL's second-best active hitting streak stalled at 17 games. He hit .412 (28-for-68) over his string of success. His 71 overall RBIs between Double-A and Triple-A trail only Ford (72) on the Yankees' farm. His composite numbers rank among the farm's best in AVG (2nd, .318) and HR (4th, 14).

OFF THE RAILS: SWB's offense ranks among the IL's best in: R/G (1st, 4.89), AVG (1st, .272), OBP (1st, .337), SLG (1st, .445), OPS (1st, .782), 2B (1st, 229), 3B (1st, 33), HR (3rd, 125) and SB (T-3rd, 86)...SWB pitching ranks among the IL's best in ERA (2nd, 3.32), WHIP (1st, 1.17) and K/9IP (2nd, 9.2)...SWB owns the IL's best record in extra-inning games (9-0), standing as the circuit's lone undefeated team in free baseball and leading the loop in extra-inning wins...SWB has 10 walk-off wins this season including seven of the extra-inning victories...At 20-8 (.714), the RailRiders boast the IL's best record in one-run games...No IL team has more wins when trailing after seven innings than the RailRiders (6)...Only Lehigh Valley (5) has more victories when trailing after eight than SWB (4)...SWB is the IL's only team undefeated when leading after seven frames (60-0)...SWB stands an IL-best 37-21 (.638) away from PNC Field...Friday night SWB secured its 70th win in its 111th game...Last year's Triple-A National Champion earned its 70th victory in its 113th contest on Aug. 5, 2016 versus Syracuse...The RailRiders have played a season-high eight error-free games in a row...The team has not been charged with a mistake in the field all month, last making a miscue in its July 30 win at Charlotte...Both of SWB's homers last night came with two outs...Six of the RailRiders' seven runs crossed on two-out RBI...The RailRiders improved to 15-3 when Caleb Smith pitches...The IL All-Star allowed two runs on six hits and one walk over six-plus innings while whiffing nine...Relievers Tyler Jones and Nick Rumbelow combined to post three scoreless innings...Rumbelow has not yet allowed a run in 10 appearances and 17.1 innings with this year's RailRiders...The IL has gone 9-for-59 (.153) against him with five walks against 16 strikeouts...The RailRiders have won five straight games both overall and on the road...A win tonight would tie the team's best road winning streak of the season, a six-gamer composed from July 2-16...That spurt saw a pair of wins at Pawtucket (July 2-3) and a four-game sweep of the Bisons at Buffalo (July 13-16) out of the All-Star break...Gwinnett went 1-for-8 with men in scoring position and has gone 1-for-11 with men in prime real estate on the series...Five of SWB's 10 hits went for extra bases...The RailRiders need to go 18-8 (.692) over their final 26 games to break the franchise's single-season wins record of 91 set by the 2002 Red Barons and tied by the 2016 RailRiders...If this year's club reaches 91 victories to tie the win mark, it would break the single-season franchise record for winning percentage set by last year's team (91-52, .636)...Gwinnett's first-inning run halted a 27-inning scoreless stretch by SWB pitching at Coolray Field including last year's playoff contests.

ON THE BUMP: Signed by NYM as a 3B in '08, hitting woes shifted Luis Cessa to P. He rose as a DSL P in '11 to AAA in '15. He has since been traded 2x. First a July '15 deal from NYM to DET in a package for Yoanis Cespedes. That off-season DET added him to the 40, then traded him that Dec. to NYY w/RHP Chad Green for LHP Justin Wilson. He began '16 in NYY pen & bounced between SWB (15G/14GS, 6-3, 3.03, .235 BAA, 1.15 WHIP) and NYY (17G/9GS, 4-4, 4.35, .241, 1.11). He started SWB's '17 home opener vs. LHV (7IP, 6H, 0R, 2BB, 6K). Last 5GS AAA: 4QS, 2-2, 1.45, .202, 0.84, 31IP, 22H, 5R, 4BB, 32K. He comes off a Fri. ND vs. PAW (5IP, 3H, 0R, 0BB, 9K).

A NYY 12th-rd'er in '07, Sahuarita, Ariz. native Manny Barreda rose to AA on NYY's farm in '13-14. Released by NYY July 17, '14, he signed w/MIL and finished '14 AA. He split '15 A+/AA w/MIL. He spent '16 out of stateside baseball, but made noise Nov. 26 '16 w/Caneros de los Mochis in the Mexican Pacific League. He fired a 138-pitch no-no in a 2-0 defeat of Naranjeros de Hermosillo and former MLB hurler Barry Enright. The only baserunners in the game: a 2-out walk of Jorge Flores in the 3rd before 18 straight retired. A 2-out error in the ninth allowed former SWB/NYY Dean Anna to reach before Barreda whiffed Luis Alfonso Garcia. In '17 w/Toros de Tijuana: 18G/17GS, 4-7, 4.06, .244, 1.29 inc. a July 16 no-no vs. Olmecas de Tabasco (9IP, 0H, 0R, 2BB, 14K, 135P/84S). He comes off a Fri. ND at CHA in his GWI debut (4.1IP, 5H, 3R, 5BB, 3K).

Nuthin' but a 'G' Thang:

AFFILIATION HISTORY: The Braves' Triple-A squad spent over four decades in Richmond from 1966-2008 before returning to Georgia in 2009. At issue was a ballpark. The Braves wanted a new one in Richmond, but Gwinnett County provided an offer they could not refuse. Atlanta owns its top affiliate which is now located just a 37-mile drive away from the big club's home, Turner Field. The G-Braves trace their history back to Atlanta. The franchise technically started as the Atlanta Crackers in 1901. They were the top farm club for the then-Milwaukee Braves before the parent club's shift to Atlanta forced the farm team to move to Richmond.

CALLING THE SHOTS: Damon Berryhill is in his first season as manager of the G-Braves. He replaced Brian Snitker who had the interim tag removed as manager of the Atlanta Braves this season. Snitker was in his fourth season skipping Gwinnett when he replaced Fredi Gonzalez as the interim manager for Atlanta. Berryhill began his coaching career in 2002 with Rancho Cucamonga (then-Angels). He joined the Texas Rangers as catching coordinator in 2006. He managed Advanced-A Bakersfield in 2008 before piloting the SS-A Ogden Raptors (2009-2013). Berryhill jumped to Triple-A in 2014 as manager of the Albuquerque Isotopes. He moved to Oklahoma City in 2015 when the Dodgers shifted their affiliation to The 405. He guided the OKC Dodgers to the PCL American Northern Division title and an 86-58 record in 2015 to earn PCL Manager of the Year honors. OKC and Berryhill followed the 2015 campaign with another division crown and an 81-60 mark last season. The former catcher spent 10 years in the majors, including five with the Chicago Cubs and three with the Atlanta Braves. He jumped from Double-A to MLB without appearing in a Triple-A game until the final two seasons of his playing career.

TASTE OF CHAMPAGNE: The RailRiders defeated the Gwinnett Braves in four games in the 2016 Governors' Cup Championship Series. SWB claimed the deciding victory at Coolray Field. Outfielder Jake Cave was named GCCS MVP as the SWB franchise claimed its second title. The G-Braves took Game 1 at PNC Field, 7-4, before the RailRiders claimed the next three. RailRiders pitching blanked the Braves 3-0 in back-to-back games to seal the title. SWB and Gwinnett have clashed twice in the postseason with the Yankees' affiliate winning both series three games to one. In 2009, the SWB Yankees won the IL North with an 81-60 record and bested the G-Braves in the Division Series. The Durham Bulls swept the Baby Bombers in the 2009 GCCS.
