RAILRIDERS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 14-5 | AWAY: 8-11 | STREAK: W 6 | LAST 5: 5-0 | LAST 10: 7-3

LAST TIME OUT: The RailRiders saw a five-run lead evaporate quickly in the ninth inning, but held on to outlast the Pawtucket Red Sox 11-10 in 11 innings on Thursday at PNC Field. The RailRiders swept the four-game set from the Paw Sox with two wins coming in walk-off fashion. **Joe Mantiplay** (2-2) took home the win with two scoreless innings, allowing one hit.

FORD TOUGH: First baseman **Mike Ford** mashed his third homer in as many days with a three-run drive to the Budweiser RailHouse in right. Through five games with SWB, Ford has slashed .318/.423/.818/1.241. Of his seven hits, five have gone for extra bases.

T-WADE: **Tyler Wade's** 12 steals have him one off the pace of Gwinnett's Ozzie Albies for tops in Triple-A. Wade is on pace to post 46 steals this season. The franchise's single-season record of 44 was set by **Tommy Barrett** in 1989. Since the start of May, Wade has gone 24-for-67 over 15 games, slashing .358/.442/.597/1.039. He made his first career start in center field on May 8 at Pawtucket and got his first nod in right field on May 16 vs. the Paw Sox. He had no outfield experience and just one start at third base in regular-season play entering 2017. On April 29, May 6 and May 14, he drew starts at the hot corner and first tasted the outfield with an April 30 nod in left. His first-ever outfield time came in the 2016 Arizona Fall League when 16 of his 18 games played saw him start in the outfield (5-RF, 4-LF, 7-CF).

STONEMASON: **Mason Williams** hit .194 (13-for-67) in 20 April games played. He has hit .286 (20-for-70) in 16 games this month with five swipes. In seven games played against the PawSox, the Pawtucket native went 11-for-30 (.367) with three RBI and five runs scored.

SIMPLY THE BEST: **Rob Refsnyder** extended the league's best active hitting streak to 18 games. He went 2-for-5 with stolen base, walk and two runs scored. During his run, Refsnyder has gone 26-for-70 (.371) with a .450 OBP.

STOP, THIEVES!: SWB ranks first in the IL in caught-stealing efficiency at 47% (16 of 34 caught). **Eddy Rodriguez** stands second in the IL in the category. He has nabbed seven men in 15 attempts (47%).

TRIPLE THREAT: **Dustin Fowler** co-leads MiLB with seven triples and is on pace to triple 27 times. The single-season franchise record is 16, set by **Shane Victorino** during his 2005 IL MVP campaign.

YOUNG GUNS: Wade, Fowler and **Clint Frazier**, the RailRiders' usual 1-2-3 hitters early this season, are all 22 years old. The IL's mean-average age for position players early this season stands a shade under 27. SWB boasts the IL's third-youngest group of position players (LHV-24.5, DUR-24.8, SWB-25.0).

THE OFFENSIVE: SWB's offense ranks among the IL's best in: R/G (2nd, 5.18), AVG (1st, .279), OBP (1st, .349), SLG (1st, .448), OPS (1st, .797), 2B (1st, 89), 3B (1st, 11) and SB (3rd, 35).

HOME COOKING: SWB has won a season-best six straight overall and seven straight at home. It stands 14-5 at PNC Field. Only the Lehigh Valley IronPigs at 15-5 have a better home winning percentage in the IL than the RailRiders.

CATCH IT HERE: PNC Field will host the 2017 Gildan Triple-A National Championship Game on Sept. 19 at 7:07 p.m. For tickets or more information, please call 570-969-BALL (2255) or visit swbrailriders.com. The RailRiders claimed the franchise's second-ever Governors' Cup as IL champs and the team's first-ever Triple-A national title with a win over El Paso in 2016.

ON THE BUMP: **Chance Adams** was dubbed NYY's 8th-best prospect by *Baseball America* after '16 when he went a combined 13-1, 2.33 between A+/AA while leading all full-season MiLB starters in BAA (.169). He left AA 4-0, pacing the EL in ERA (1.03). He tossed seven-plus innings for the first time this season and third time on his short starting career in his final AA start May 8 at Akron (7IP, 8H, 2R, 2BB, 5K, 1HR - Win). He won his AAA debut at SYR May 14 (5IP, 2H, 0R, 3BB, 6K - 97P/57S).

A MIN 5th-rd'er in '13 out of Indiana, 6'10" **Aaron Slegers** signed for \$380,000. The former walk-on spent '16 at AA: 25GS, 10-7, 3.41, .258, 1.26 and ranked among the SL's best in wins (T-4th), ERA (9th) and IP (T-4th, 145.1). He did not allow a hit in his AAA debut, an Apr. 11 win at BUF (6IP, 0H, 0R, 3BB, 7K). He lost the next two nods vs SYR Apr. 16 (3.2IP, 11H, 5R, 1BB, 6K, 1HR, 1BK) and at CHA Apr. 22 (5IP, 10H, 7R/6ER, 1BB, 3K). Since then he has won twice, each time allowing 2R/1ER over 15.1 IP between the two victories. Sandwiched between the triumphs was a loss at LHV May 8 (4IP, 7H, 4R, 1BB, 2K, 1HR).

Red Wings Report

HEY, I KNOW YOU!: Former SWB (1994-95) manager **Mike Quade** is in his third season skipping Rochester. He replaced **Gene Glynn** who left to become the Twins' third-base coach. Quade, 60, was a roving outfield/baserunning coordinator with the Yankees in 2014. The Evanston, Ill. native went 95-104 over his one-plus season managing the Cubs from 2010-11. He took over when former Yankee **Lou Pinella** retired and guided Chicago to a 24-13 record to finish 2010 - the second-best mark in MLB during that time.

AFFILIATIONS: The Rochester franchise was with the Cardinals for 32 years (1929-60) and was the Orioles' top farm club for 42 years thereafter (1961-02). The allegiance shifted to the Twins in 2003.

THE LONGEST GAME: The history-rich team shares a record that has stood since 1981. On April 18 of that year, the Red Wings and Pawtucket Red Sox started what would prove to be the longest game in the history of professional baseball. The 33-inning game took eight hours and 25 minutes to complete over three different days. It was suspended just after 4 a.m. on April 19 and concluded on June 23 as a 3-2 Pawtucket win at McCoy Stadium. The game started 30 minutes late due to issues with the stadium's lights. It included two future Hall of Famers in Rochester's **Cal Ripken, Jr.** (2-for-13) and Pawtucket's **Wade Boggs** (4-for-12) who tied the game in the 21st inning off of reliever **Steve Luebber**.
