BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN

BLUE ROCKS WIN PITCHING DUEL TO START SECOND HALF: The Wilmington Blue Rocks started the second half in winning fashion as they held on in a 2-1 pitching duel against the Potomac Nationals Thursday night at Northwest Federal Field. The combination of **Anthony Bender** and **Oreidy Gomez** kept the P-Nats offense in check while **Blake Perkins** picked up a pair of hits, scored twice and reached base four times in his Blue Rocks debut against his former team in the win.

ROCKS OFF AND RUNNING: The Blue Rocks wasted no time getting back into base stealing mode as they swiped five bags against Potomac in Thursday's series opening win.
 -The five stolen bases matches a franchise-record as **Nick Heath** stole two and **Blake Perkins, Travis Jones** and **Khalil Lee** each stole a bag.

-More impressively, the Blue Rocks have done it three times this season. The first was also against Potomac back on April 7 and then again a week later against Lynchburg.
 -On the season, the Rocks are second in the Carolina League with 81 stolen bases.
 -They also have an impressive 74% success rate stealing bases this season (81 out of 110).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Wilmington Blue Rocks have been away from their friendly confines of Frawley Stadium for quite some time.

-However, the Blue Rocks have won their last three straight road contests, including back-to-back wins against the Winston-Salem Dash who won the Southern Division First Half title to earn a series split.
 -The three-game road winning streak matches the longest for the Blue Crew this season. They also won three in a row from April 19-21 when they took three of the first four games from the Keys.
 -The last time Wilmington won four straight road games was back on July 16-18, 2014 against Potomac.
 -The Rocks last played on the Riverfront on June 10 against Frederick in a rain-shortened game.

NEW HALF, NEW FACES: With the start of the second half of the Carolina League season underway, the Wilmington Blue Rocks have a handful of new players on the roster.

-Arguably the most intriguing new addition to the Rocks is switch-hitting outfielder **Blake Perkins**, who spent the first half of the season with Potomac.
 -Originally a second round pick by Washington in 2015, Perkins was one of three players dealt to Kansas City from Washington as the Nationals acquired former Blue Rock and All-Star reliever **Kelvin Herrera** on June 18 and is rated as the 15th-best prospect in the Royals' system according to MLB Pipeline.com.

-RHP **Nolan Watson** joins the Blue Rocks roster after starting the year in Low-A Lexington.
 -The former first round pick by the Royals in 2015 out of Lawrence North High School will make his Carolina League debut in the third game of this series.
 -Infielder **Travis Jones** was also promoted from Low-A Lexington and put together solid numbers.
 -The 29th round pick by Kansas City in 2017 led the Legends in batting average (.285), hits (65), doubles (13), stolen bases (14), second in runs scored (41) and tied for second in RBI (32).
 -All-Stars **Kort Peterson** and **Bryan Brickhouse** were promoted to Double-A Northwest Arkansas after putting together strong first halves of the season.

LEE THE ON-BASE MACHINE: Blue Rocks' outfielder **Khalil Lee** has been solid at the plate since the month of May.

-The Carolina League All-Star is slashing .273/.394/.398 with 25 RBI, 28 walks and 28 runs scored in 46 games.
 -On the season, he paces the league with 47 walks and tied for sixth in all of MiLB with that mark.
 -He is also second in the CL in on-base percentage (.400)
 -Has hit safely in 12 of 18 contests in the month of June.
 -He leads the team with 17 multi-hit games and 36 RBI.

BURT PROVIDING THE HURT: Second-year Blue Rock **D.J. Burt** is not suffering from a sophomore slump in the Carolina League.

-He was named to the Carolina League All-Star Classic this season and has been one of the best table setters in the league.
 -Burt closed out the first half with a pair of hits, including a double and drove in two runs.
 -He has a hit in 34 of his 50 games played and has picked up a hit in 18 of his last 25 games and slashing .284/.352/.389 during that span.
 -Burt has served as the Rocks' utility man this season, making 16 starts at third base, 11 at second base, 10 at shortstop and seven in left field.
 -Made his first-career start at the hot corner coming on May 26 at home against Salem.
 -This the first season in his professional career that he has played in the outfield.

CANCEL CLEANING UP NICELY: Blue Rock's infielder **Gabriel Cancel** continues to produce as the cleanup hitter this season.

-The 21-year-old has hit six different spots in the lineup for the Blue Crew this season, but he has thrived batting fourth.
 -In 11 games as the cleanup man, Cancel is hitting .351 (13-for-37) with four doubles, a home run and 12 RBI.
 -He also has an on-base percentage of .429 and slugging percentage of .541.
 -On the season, when Cancel has not hit in the cleanup spot, he is hitting .244 (40-164).

THEY SAID IT, MANAGER DARRYL KENNEDY: (On Blake Perkins' debut) "He fits in our lineup really well. He adds a lot of speed and defense and we have quite a few of those guys on this team. I was excited to just get back and get after it with some speed and create some stuff. The guys did a great job...**(On what Travis Jones brings to team)** "He brings a lot of energy and he can play multiple positions. He can play anywhere in the infield and outfield and if it came down to it I can probably put him behind the plate. He brings a veteran and right-handed presence. Sometimes, our lineup is very left-handed dominant. I had him in the Arizona League for a few weeks and he's going to be fun to watch."

-Righty **Gerson Garabito** makes his 14th start of the season and fifth against the P-Nats

-The Dominican Republic native signed with the Royals on Sept. 17, 2012.
 -He is rated as the #16 prospect in the system according to Baseball America and #27 by MLB Pipeline.com.

-Last time out June 15 at Winston-Salem he did not factor in the decision.
 -He worked five innings, allowed two runs (both earned), four hits, walked three and struck out seven.

-On the season, Garabito has allowed two earned runs or less in 9 of his 13 starts.
 -Against Potomac this season: 0-2, 6.06 ERA in four starts.

-16.1 IP, 14H, 16R/11ER, 12BB, 19K, .226 BAA.
 -Splits vs. LHB/RHB: .204 vs. LHB / .284 vs. RHB

-Garabito repeated at Low-A Lexington last season and put together a nice bounce back campaign despite missing seven weeks due to shoulder tendinitis.

-Last season, the 22-year-old went 4-5 with a 2.81 ERA in 15 starts.
 -He struck out 72 batters, walked just 19 in 77.0 innings of work and held opponents to an impressive .196 batting average.

-He also had a 24.2-innings streak in which he did not allow an earned run from May 4 to Aug. 15.
 -The streak was interrupted due to his injury that included two rehab starts in the AZL.

-In 2017 vs. LHB .174 BAA / vs. RHB .203 BAA

-He features a fastball that ranges from 89-94 m.p.h to go along with a good curveball he can locate and a changeup he got back to using last season.

-Left-hander **Ben Braymer** makes his eighth appearance of the season with Potomac and just his second start of the 2018 campaign.

-He was selected by Washington in the 18th round of the 2016 Draft out of Auburn.

-In his last outing on June 16 against Buies Creek was in relief.
 -He allowed an earned runs on three hits and struck out four in two innings of work.

-His only start of the season came back on June 11 at Salem in which he earned the victory.
 -Braymer tossed six scoreless innings, allowed just two hits, walked a batter and struck out six.

-Faced Wilmington in relief on May 24 and allowed an earned run on two hits in 2.2 innings of work. He walked one and also struck out a batter.

-The 24-year-old started the season in Low-A Hagerstown before being promoted to Potomac on May 10.

-He served as a reliever in most of his time with the Suns and allowed just five earned runs in over 25.2 innings of work (1.75 ERA) to go along with three wins.
 -He features a fastball, changeup and curveball.

THE BOOK ON GERSON GARABITO: Gerson Garabito was signed as an international free agent on September 17, 2012 by Kansas City. He enters this season ranked as a top-30 prospect in the system according to both Baseball America (#16) and MLB.com (#30). The last two seasons for the 22-year-old had to overcome different types of adversity. In 2016, he spent his first year in full-season baseball with Low-A Lexington and struggled. He went 2-11 with a 4.8 ERA in 18 starts. In 80.2 innings he allowed 78 hits, 43 earned runs, struck out 61 batters and walked 35. However, the Royals believed he showed more promise than the numbers indicated. Last season, he repeated in Lexington and put together a nice bounce back season. He was pitching better and had a 24.2-inning streak in which he did not allow an earned run with the Legends from May 4 to Aug. 15. The streak was interrupted by a seven-week stint on the disabled list due to shoulder tendonitis in his right shoulder. Ultimately he would miss almost two months of the season. He made two rehab starts in Surprise, Arizona before rejoining the Legends to finish the season. Overall with Lexington, he went 4-5 with a 2.811 ERA in 15 starts. He tossed 77 innings and allowed 52 hits, 24 earned runs, 19 walks and 72 strikeouts. He also held South Atlantic League hitters to a .190 batting average. From 2013-2015, the right-handed hurler spent his first three seasons in the organization at he Rookie-level. He was with the Surprise Royals in 2015 in the Arizona League for his stateside debut before spending his first two years as a pro in the Dominican Summer League. Scouts have raved about Garabito's ability to command all three off his pitches. His fastball ranges from 89-94 m.p.h. and has a lot of movement to go along with a curveball that he can locate well and a changeup he used more last season. Scouts believe he has the repertoire to remain in the rotation and slot in as a No.4 or No.5 starter, but can also see his stuff play as a reliever.

LAST TIME OUT: In Garabito's last start on June 15 at Winston-Salem, he did not factor in the decision. He lasted five innings, allowed two runs (both earned) on four hits, walked three and struck out seven batters. On the season, the righty has allowed two earned runs or less in 9 of his 13 starts including his first seven starts of the season.

GARABITO HAS BEEN SOLID THIS SEASON: Throughout the season, Garabito has been one of the more consistent pitchers for the Blue Rocks this season. He started the season not allowing more than three earned runs in his first seven starts, going 1-2 with a respectable 2.34 ERA. During those 34.2 innings, he allowed just nine earned runs, struck out 29 batters, walked 22 and held opponents to an impressive .190 batting average. He has allowed more than four earned runs in just three starts this season with two coming in back-to-back starts on May 19 and May 24 when he allowed 12 earned runs in just 10.2 innings of work. The righty is tied for second on the team in innings pitched (67.0) and tied for second with 51 strikeouts.

ON OVERCOMING HIS INJURY LAST YEAR: Garabito showed a sense of mental toughness after not only bouncing back from a poor 2016 season statistically, but also an injury that could've derailed his season last year. "It was a good year, but it was a little hard for me. I was hurt for about a two-and-a-half months of the season. It was shoulder tendonitis. The rehab process was long and tough. One day, it would feel a lot better and I would go out and throw. I could only go for one inning and I couldn't throw anymore. So I had to rest for another month and then started back up playing catch." A team player, Garabito was unhappy he was unable to perform on the diamond. "It was so hard for me because I try to do my best. That was the frustrating part for me is because I couldn't help my teammates and that did not make me happy. Once I was able to pitch again with no pain, I was so happy."

MAKING IMPROVEMENTS IN THE OFFSEASON: Scouts are impressed with Garabito's ability to deliver his pitches with a smooth delivery and his command on his pitches. Garabito focused on the latter this past winter. "I worked on all of my pitches this offseason, but my changeup specifically and my control with it. I used it more last season than I did before. My best pitch is my fastball because of my control of it and velocity."

ANOTHER PEDRO FAN: There have been a handful of players from the Dominican Republic to make it to the MLB and have great success. Two pitchers that represent the Dominican Republic in the Baseball Hall of Fame are Juan Marichal and Pedro Martinez. Garabito grew up idolizing the 2015 inductee Martinez. "I loved Pedro. When I watched him pitch, especially against the New York Yankees it was so fun to see. He would throw his fastball and then come back with his breaking ball. It was so good to watch and he had a lot of great pitches. Growing up in the Dominican Republic it was easy to route for him."

THOUGHTS ON BEING A RANKED PROSPECT: The righty recognizes that it's an honor to be rated as a top-30 prospect, but he realizes he can't let it be a distraction. "It does make you feel a little important, but I still need to work hard this year because it doesn't matter what I'm ranked. You can be on the top one year and a couple years later you can be down on the bottom. You need to continue to work hard because you never know what can happen in the future."
