**Giants Conclude Series At Stockton...** The San Jose Giants and Stockton Ports play the rubber game of their three-game series this afternoon at Banner Island Ballpark. Stockton won the series opener on Friday night by a 3-2 score in 10 innings before the Giants bounced back with a 2-1 victory yesterday. Conner Menez (2-2, 3.63 ERA) is slated to start on the mound for San Jose today.

**Road Warriors...** A victory this afternoon would give the Giants their third consecutive road series win. San Jose won two of three games at Lancaster from May 4-6 before taking two of three at Modesto from May 8-10. The Giants last won three straight road series in August 2015. San Jose is 6-3 in their last nine road games overall.

**Close Calls...** Six out of San Jose's last nine games have been decided by one run. The Giants are 10-7 in one-run games overall this season. Only Inland Empire (11-7) has played more one-run games than San Jose this year.

**Inside The Season Series...** The Giants are 4-2 against Stockton this season (3-1 at Municipal Stadium, 1-1 at Banner Island Ballpark). The last four games played between the teams have been decided by one run with three of those games having gone into extra innings. San Jose is batting .214 against the Ports this season (3.5 runs per game) with a team ERA of 2.18. After today, the Giants have two more series' against Stockton in the first half (June 5-7 at Muni, June 11-14 at Stockton).

**Team Stats...** The Giants are second in the California League in team batting average (.267) and second in ERA (3.45). San Jose is third in the league in runs scored (5.0 runs per game) and third in home runs (34). On the mound, the Giants have allowed the fewest home runs in the league (17), but have issued the most walks (174, 4.0 per game). San Jose's 55 errors this year are tied for the second-most in the league.

**Franco File...** Wander Franco brings a season-high tying seven-game hitting streak into today's action. Franco currently leads the California League with 16 doubles this season. He's hit 12 doubles over his last 19 games (.369 AVG). Franco is also fourth in the league in hits (51).

**Holding Leads / Late Comebacks...** The Giants are a perfect 18-0 this season when leading after seven innings. Only San Jose and Lake Elsinore are unbeaten this year when holding a lead after the seventh. Conversely, the Giants have won a league-high four games this season when trailing after seven innings.

**On Deck...** Following an off day tomorrow, the Giants continue their season-high nine-game road trip with a three-game set in Modesto beginning on Tuesday. After their series versus the Nuts, San Jose concludes the road trip next weekend at Lake Elsinore – their final series versus a South Division team in the first half.

**Cycle x2...** April 11 was an historic night for the San Jose Giants as both Gio Brusa and Jalen Miller hit for the cycle in an 18-6 victory at Lancaster. Brusa (4-for-6, 2B, 3B, HR, 6 RBI) completed his cycle with a triple in the top of the eighth. Miller (5-for-7, 2B, 3B, HR, 4 RBI, SB), who tied a Giants single-game team record with five hits, tripled in the ninth inning for San Jose's second cycle of the night. The duo became the fourth and fifth players in the 31-year history of the San Jose Giants to hit for the cycle. Prior to Brusa and Miller, the last SJ Giant to hit for the cycle was Thomas Neal on April 28, 2009 at Lancaster.

\* Is in his third professional season ... Selected by the San Francisco Giants in the 14th round of the 2016 draft.

\* Today marks his eighth start of the season with the Giants ... Ranks eighth in the California League in strikeouts (52) and tenth in ERA (3.63) ... Has allowed no runs in three out of his seven starts.

\* Is 0-2 with a 7.98 ERA (13 ER/14.2 IP) over his last three starts after going 2-0 with a 0.45 ERA (1 ER/20.0 IP) over his first four starts.

\* Has faced Modesto in four out of his last five starts ... Most recent outing came against the Nuts on May 15 at Municipal Stadium ... Pitched 5 1/3 innings with five runs (all earned) and six hits allowed ... Walked three and struck out eight ... Surrendered just one run over the first five innings (Giants led 4-1) before giving up four runs in the sixth ... Suffered the loss (Giants lost game 7-5).

\* Struck out a career-high tying 10 batters over 5 1/3 innings on May 3 against Visalia (3 R).

\* Has struck out at least seven in six out of seven starts ... Has given up just one home run in 34 2/3 innings with San Jose (Modesto's Gareth Morgan on May 10).

\* Made a spot-start for Sacramento (AAA) on April 12 against Reno ... Pitched four innings and allowed four runs (all earned) ... Suffered the loss.

\* Spent the entire 2017 season in the San Jose starting rotation ... Was 7-7 with a 4.41 ERA in 23 games (22 starts) ... Was named to the midseason California League All-Star team.

\* Led last year's Giants staff in wins, starts, innings pitched (114 1/3) and was second in strikeouts (99) ... Won San Jose's Pitcher of the Year award.

\* Allowed two earned runs or fewer in 12 out of his 22 starts last season ... Month-by-month ERA's: April (2.78), May (3.62), June (3.99), July (7.56) and August (8.03).

\* Also pitched for San Jose in 2016 ... Was 2-0 with a 4.94 ERA in six games (five starts) ... Was the first player from the 2016 San Francisco Giants draft class to reach the Class-A Advanced level.

\* Attended The Master's University (NAIA school in Santa Clarita, CA) ... Had a 2.47 ERA in 102 innings during his final season at The Master's in 2016 ... Pitched in the 2016 NAIA World Series in Lewiston, Idaho.

\* Was rated the top prospect in the Alaska Baseball League (collegiate summer league) in 2015.

\* Attended San Benito High School in Hollister, CA (one hour south of San Jose) ... Pitched at Municipal Stadium while in high school during the Central Coast Section playoffs.

\* Grandfather, Bill Plummer, played 10 years in the major leagues with the Cincinnati Reds, Chicago Cubs and Seattle Mariners ... Was a catcher with Cincinnati from 1970-77 ... Plummer previously managed the California League's San Jose Missions in 1980 and is currently the minor league catching coordinator for the Arizona Diamondbacks.

### #26 Gio Brusa (.248, 5 HR, 24 RBI, 1 SB)

**Current Hit Streak: 0**

- \* First baseman is in his third professional season ... Selected in the 6th round of the 2016 draft.
- \* Hit for the cycle on April 11 at Lancaster joining teammate Jalen Miller in accomplishing the feat that night.
- \* Spent the 2017 season with San Jose ... Hit .237 with 17 home runs and 55 RBI's in 113 games.
- \* Tied for the team lead in home runs last year ... Was also second on the club in doubles and fifth in RBI's.
- \* Was an outfielder in his first two seasons before transitioning to first base this year.
- \* Earned Northwest League All-Star honors with Salem-Keizer (Short-Season) in 2016.
- \* Led the Northwest League with 10 home runs in '16 ... Hit .264 with 42 RBI's in 53 games ... Won All-Star home run derby.
- \* Attended the University of the Pacific ... Finished career second in school history in doubles, fourth in HR and fifth in RBI's.
