**Giants Conclude Series Against Visalia...** The San Jose Giants look for a four-game sweep of the Visalia Rawhide when the teams conclude their series this afternoon at Municipal Stadium. The Giants have won the first three games of the series earning victories of 8-6 on Friday, 10-2 on Saturday and 6-5 yesterday. Carlos Sano (1-1, 3.89 ERA) is slated to make the start on the mound for San Jose today. The Giants haven't swept a series since taking three straight against Visalia from July 31-August 2, 2017 at Municipal Stadium.

**Winning Ways...** The Giants have won three straight games and five out of their last seven. A victory today would match San Jose's longest winning streak of the season (four games, April 13-16 and April 20-23). With wins the last games, the Giants have clinched their first series victory since taking two of three at Modesto from June 8-10. San Jose has also won their first home series since May 28-31 against Visalia.

**Offensive Surge...** Over their last seven games (5-2 record), the Giants are batting .308 as a team and averaging 5.7 runs per contest. San Jose has scored 24 runs and hit six homers in the first three games of the current series against Visalia.

**Monday Matinee...** Today is one of only two July day games for the Giants (July 26 vs. Rancho Cucamonga). San Jose is 11-8 in day games this season.

**League Leaderboard...** Several Giants hitters rank among the California League leaders. Jalen Miller leads the league in hits (104), is tied for third in doubles (26), tied for third in runs scored (54), tied for seventh in RBI's (51), eighth in slugging (.472) and tied for tenth in home runs (12). Gio Brusa is fifth in the league in home runs (14), tied for seventh in RBI's (51) and sixth in slugging (.495). Wander Franco is tied for third in doubles (26) and seventh in hits (99) while Johneshwy Fargas is second in stolen bases (27).

**The Long Ball...** The Giants have hit 29 home runs in 25 second half games. San Jose's 20 homers in July are second in the California League (Rancho Cucamonga 23). Conversely, the Giants have allowed 23 home runs this month – tops in the league.

**Close Calls...** Last night was the Giants' league-leading 32nd one-run game of the season (15-17 record). San Jose has also played a league-high 11 extra-inning games (6-5 record).

**Off Day Ahead...** Today ends a season-high stretch of 26 consecutive days with a game for the Giants. San Jose will enjoy their first off day since the All-Star break tomorrow. Beginning with the start of the second half through July 29, the Giants will play 38 games in 39 days.

**On Deck...** Following tomorrow's off day, the Giants embark on a six-game Southern California road trip to Rancho Cucamonga (three games) and Lake Elsinore (three games). San Jose has lost their last eight games to the Quakes. The Giants' 10-15 second half record includes a 1-8 mark against Rancho Cucamonga (9-7 against all other teams). San Jose returns to Municipal Stadium on Tuesday, July 24 for a six-game homestand versus Rancho Cucamonga and Inland Empire.

**Major League All-Stars...** Two former San Jose Giants – Brandon Crawford and Buster Posey – have been named Major League All-Stars. Crawford will start at shortstop for the National League and Posey was selected as a reserve (but will not play). Crawford was chosen to his second All-Star game while Posey's sixth selection matches the most by any former San Jose Giant (Joe Nathan). The Major League All-Star Game is tomorrow night in Washington D.C.

\* Pitched at least three innings in five out of his seven relief appearances ... Has a 5.04 ERA as a reliever.

\* Was added to San Jose's roster on May 21 from Augusta (A) ... Made two relief appearances with the GreenJackets before receiving a promotion ... Tossed five scoreless innings with one hit allowed and seven strikeouts in Augusta ... Made his season debut on May 10 after opening the year at Extended Spring Training.

\* Pitched in the Nicaraguan Professional League last season for the Rivas Giants ... Had a 2.86 ERA over 11 appearances (two starts) ... Struck out 21 and walked 10 in 22 innings.

### #39 Kelvin Beltre (.246, 2 HR, 8 RBI, 1 SB)

**Current Hit Streak: 5 games**

- \* Infielder is in his fifth professional season ... Signed as an international free agent in 2013 at age 16.
- \* Currently ranked the #19 prospect in the San Francisco organization by *MLB.com* ... Third-highest infielder on list.
- \* Joined San Jose from Extended Spring Training on June 7 ... Suffered fractured leg from a foul ball during spring training.
- \* Spent the last two seasons with Augusta (A) ... Batted .253 with 6 HR, 37 RBI's and 15 SB in 118 games last year.
- \* Was a second baseman last year after playing primarily third base in 2016 ... Began pro career as a shortstop.

### #26 Gio Brusa (.255, 14 HR, 51 RBI, 4 SB)

**Current Hit Streak: 4 games**

- \* First baseman is in his third professional season ... Selected in the 6th round of the 2016 draft.
- \* Hit for the cycle on April 11 at Lancaster joining teammate Jalen Miller in accomplishing the feat that night.
- \* Was an outfielder in his first two pro seasons before transitioning to first base this year.
- \* Spent the entire 2017 season with San Jose ... Batted .237 with team-high tying 17 home runs and 55 RBI's in 113 games.
- \* Earned Northwest League All-Star honors with Salem-Keizer (Short-Season) in 2016.
- \* Led the Northwest League with 10 home runs in '16 ... Hit .264 with 42 RBI's in 53 games ... Won All-Star home run derby.
- \* Attended the University of the Pacific ... Finished career second in school history in doubles, fourth in HR and fifth in RBI's.
