## Syracuse Chiefs LHP Tommy Milone (3-4, 4.99) vs. Pawtucket Red Sox RHP Chandler Shepherd (4-4, 3.36)

The Drive for Five and Over . 500 - The Pawtucket Red Sox bid to match their longest winning streak of the season tonight when they host the Syracuse Chiefs (AAA-Washington) in the middle game of their 3-game weekend series tonight at $6: 15 \mathrm{pm}$ (live on myRITV). The PawSox have presently won 4 in a row to match their second longest winning streak of the season behind a 5-game winning streak from May 27-31. Pawtucket's current 4-game winning streak has brought them back to even at 36-36 on the season the first time they have been at .500 since May $11(16-16)$. With a victory tonight they would move above .500 for the first time since May 8 at 15-14.

This Series - Last night the PawSox edged Syracuse, 5-4 in the first appearance for the Chiefs at McCoy Stadium this season (the Chiefs were the last team from the IL North to visit). Just over a week ago the PawSox swept a 3-game series in Syracuse from June 11-13 by scores of 3-1, 5-3, and 5-1. So Pawtucket has now won 4 in a row over the Chiefs. The teams also met in Syracuse from May 10-13 with the Chiefs winning 3 of 4 during that series. Their next series against each other will also come here at McCoy -a 4game set just after the All-Star break from July 12-15.

This Homestand - This 7-game homestand (4-1 thus far after the Sox took 3 of 4 from Buffalo earlier this week and are up 1-0 vs. Syracuse) continues tonight and will feature Beatles post-game fireworks. The homestand concludes tomorrow (Sunday at $1: 35 \mathrm{pm}$ ) and will be highlighted by a tribute to the Armed Services before the game and Run the Bases after. The PawSox will be gone all of next week for a 7-game roadtrip that begins with 4-games in Buffalo from Monday - Thursday (with the first three games at 7:05 pm and the finale at $1: 05 \mathrm{pm}$ ) before a 3-game weekend set at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre next Friday ( $7: 05 \mathrm{pm}$ ), Saturday ( $6: 35 \mathrm{pm}$ ), and Sunday ( $1: 05 \mathrm{pm}$ ). The Sox will head home after the Sunday afternoon game in Moosic, PA and be back at McCoy for just two games - the traditional July $2 \& 3$ patriotic firework games (both at $6: 15 \mathrm{pm}$ vs. Rochester).

Home Sweet Home - The PawSox own a season-best 4-game home winning streak. Pawtucket has improved to 21-17 at home to equal their season-high of 4-games over . 500 at McCoy from May 22 (12-8). The Sox are 15-19 on the road.

The Chase Is On - The (tied for) $3^{\text {rd }}$-place Pawtucket Red Sox (with Rochester) are now just a $1 / 2 \mathrm{~GB}$ of $2^{\text {nd }}$-place Buffalo. The PawSox are still within $-51 / 2$ GB of front-running Lehigh Valley in the IL North. The last time they were closer than 5-games out was June 3 ( $-41 / 2 \mathrm{~GB}$ ).

What Have You Done for Me Lately - Pawtucket has presently won 4 games in a row (Game 2 Tuesday, Wednesday \& Thursday nights all vs. Buffalo and Friday night vs. Syracuse) following a 3-game losing streak (last Saturday \& Sunday at Lehigh Valley and then Game 1 Tuesday vs. Buffalo). The Sox also had a 4-game winning streak from June 10-13 (that fell one shy of equaling their longest of the season when the Sox won 5 straight from May 27-31). Pawtucket has won 9 of 13 and 17 of their last 26 games since May 27. Before that, the Sox had lost 15 of their previous 19 games from May 7-26.

Homer Heaven - The last 9 games the PawSox have homered in - they have won dating back to June 6 at home vs. Louisville. Pawtuket is now $6^{\text {th }}$ in the league with 55 HR on the season.

Giddy $\boldsymbol{U p}$ - For what it's worth... Syracuse has grounded into the most double plays in the league with 67 GIDP while Pawtucket is next with 64 GIDP. Last night the Chiefs grounded into 3 DP's while the Sox hit into 2 DP's.

North Face - On June 11 the PawSox began a span of 32 straight games against IL North rivals through July 15 (which is just after the All-Star break). Pawtucket is $22-26$ vs. their IL North foes thus far. They are 7-8 vs. the IL West and 7-2 vs. the IL South.

Getting in Tune in June - The PawSox are heading into the final week of June with a 12-9 mark. They are hitting .269 (188-for-698) with 17 HR this month along with a 3.20 ERA (71 ER in 180 IP). Pawtucket, who finished 11-10 this April and 13-17 this May (hitting just .227 in May), had their best month of last season in June going 17-14. They are scheduled to play 29 games in 30 days this June.

Series Business - Pawtucket - up 1-0 in this 3-game set vs. Syracuse - is 8-11-4 in their first 26 series of the season ( 8 wins, 10 losses, and 4 splits). They have posted three 3 -game sweeps this season along with a 2 -game sweep.

Getting to Know You - Pawtucket is 5-3 this season vs. Syracuse after going 15-5 vs. the Chiefs last year. These clubs will have met a total of 10 times over a one month span since June 11 through July $15 \ldots$ including this current 3-game weekend set in Pawtucket (the first time the Chiefs have come to McCoy Stadium this season). The teams will be back in Pawtucket for a 4 -game series just after the All-Star break from July 12-15. Overall these two teams will face each other 18 times this season... 11 in Syracuse and 7 in Pawtucket.

2018 Season-Series vs. Syracuse - Prior to this weekend (and Friday night's 5-4 Sox triumph over the Chiefs), Pawtucket most recently had swept a 3-game series in Syracuse last week from June 11-13. The PawSox won by scores of 3-1, 5-3 (rallying for 3 runs in the top of the $9^{\text {th }}$ to win that game) and then completed the sweep with a 5-1 victory on June 13 . Syracuse took 3 of 4 from the PawSox one month prior to that at NBT Bank Stadium in their first series against each other. The Chiefs won the opener on May 10, $6-4$; the Sox notched their only victory of the series the next night, 12-2; but Syracuse won both games over the weekend by 6-5 and 9-1 scores on May $12 \& 13$.

Stats vs. the 'Cuse - The Sox are hitting . 283 in the 8 games vs. the Chiefs (76-for-269) with 2 HR (Adam Lind \& Mike Ohlman) and 40 runs scored. Sox pitchers vs. the Chiefs are 5-3 with a 3.89 ERA ( 30 ER in 69.1 IP) allowing 32 runs (with only two homers for Syracuse).

2017 Season-Series vs. Syracuse - Pawtucket will have to go a ways to have similar success against Syracuse this season as they did last year when they went $15-5$ vs. the Chiefs including a $9-1$ record at NBT Bank Stadium in Syracuse. The PawSox were actually 152 at one point vs. Syracuse last season before getting swept in a 3-game set last August 1-3 vs. the Chiefs at McCoy. The 15 wins in 2017 against one opponent in a season tied a PawSox franchise-record...the Sox have won 15 games against an International League club on a couple of occasions - most recently prior to last year when they went 15-1 vs. Lehigh Valley in 2008 - but they have never won 16 games vs. another IL team in a single season.

Stats vs. the Chiefs in 2017 - The PawSox out-scored the Chiefs, 107-61 in the season-series in 2017. The Sox hit . 293 in the 20 games vs. Syracuse (easily their best against any other club) with 25 HR including 7 HR by Rusney Castillo (Rusney hit .368 in 18 games vs. the Chiefs with 9 2B, 7 HR and 16 RBI last year). PawSox pitchers went $15-5$ with a 3.05 ERA vs. Syracuse last year.

A Hectic May - The PawSox finished an extremely busy May with a 13-17 record for the month. The topsy-turvy travel month included four different homestands and four different roadtrips. Pitchers posted a 3.60 ERA in May while batters hit . 227 with 22 HR and 97 runs in 30 May games (for an average of 3.2 runs per game). The Sox played 30 games in 31 days in May with just one scheduled off-day (May 17) during the entire month.

April Comes up a Winner - The PawSox posted a winning April for the $6^{\text {th }}$ time in the last 8 years as they finished the month with an 11-10 record and in $2^{\text {nd }}$-place in the IL North ( -2 GB of front-running Syracuse at the time). Pawtucket has had just one losing month of April since 2010 and that came last year (10-12). The Sox hit .233 in April with 16 HR in 21 games while pitchers were 11-10 with a 3.51 ERA along with a league-leading 230 strikeouts in 190 innings.

Trending Positive - The PawSox (now at 36-36) were a season-low 8-games below . 500 on May 26 at 19-27. It was their lowest point since they ended last year with a 67-75 record. On May 6 the Sox had matched their season-high of 3-games over the .500 mark (15-12) from April 28 when they were 11-8. Pawtucket was a season-worst - $81 / 2$ GB of front-running Lehigh Valley on May 26 and had been in last-place in the IL North for much of the last week of May. The Sox were in $1^{\text {st }}$-place on May 7.

One and Done - The PawSox are 14-7 in 1-run games this season (.667) - the best winning pct. in 1-run affairs in the league.

Throwing Strikes - Pawtucket pitchers are $2^{\text {nd }}$ in the International League with 651 strikeouts. Durham leads with 693 SO. Sox hurlers have posted strikeout games of 20 (April 9), 18 (April 20), 15 (three times), 14 (twice), 13, 12 (four times), 11 (three times), and 10 (13 times) this season.

Walk This Way - PawSox batters were last in the league in team batting for most of May and into June, but they are now $11^{\text {th }}$ with their .241 average...their highest since April 28 at .242 . The Sox are tied with Lehigh Valley for the IL lead with 250 walks.

Defensive - Last year the PawSox led the International League with a .987 fielding pct. while making a league-low 64 errors on the season (both new franchise-records). This season the Sox are next to last in the league with a .977 fielding pct. ( 57 errors in 2501 total chances) as their 57 errors are the most in the IL.

Working Overtime - Pawtucket (5-1), Rochester (5-2), and Buffalo (5-3) have an IL-high five extra inning victories this season. Pawtucket has played five overtime games at home (winning 4 of those 5 extra inning games at McCoy). However, the Sox have not been involved in an extra inning game since May 14 (a 6-5, 10-inning win vs. Buffalo).

Blanketed - The PawSox have been shutout a league-high 9 times this season. Pawtucket was blanked 9 times total in 2017. They went 18-9 in shuout games last year. They are 5-9 in shutout games thus far in 2018. Prior to the $4-0$ loss in Game 1 to Buffalo on June 19, the Sox had not been blanked since May 20 (3-0 at Rochester).

A Look Back Before We Go Forth - Pawtucket finished 67-75 last year and in $4^{\text {th }}$-place in the IL North for the second straight season. They dropped to a season-low 9-games under . 500 on August 26 at 62-71. On July 18, 2017 the PawSox were a season-best 6-games over .500 at 50-44. Pawtucket finished 34-36 in games played at McCoy Stadium last season. Thus they finished with just their second losing season at McCoy in the last 8 years. The Sox went 33-39 on the road.

Portland (27-45) - The Portland Sea Dogs (AA) were 7-2 winners at home vs. Trenton last night. Matt Kent (5-4) was the starter and winner-6 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 4 SO. Josh Ockimey (\#11) and Jhon Nunez (\#1) both crushed 2-run homers to pace the offense.
Salem (1-1)/(33-37) - The Salem Red Sox (A) defeated Frederick last night, 5-3. Darwinzon Hernandez had a strong start but was not involved in the decision - $6 \mathrm{IP}, 6 \mathrm{H}, 2 \mathrm{R}, 2 \mathrm{BB}, 6 \mathrm{SO}$. The win went to Jake Cosart (3-0) with 1.1 hitless innings of relief. Brett Netzer had a big night with 3 hits including an RBI triple.

Greenville (1-1)/(26-45) - The Greenville Drive (A) fell to Asheville, 6-2 last night. Durin O’Linger (2-1) was the loser in relief3.1 IP, 9 H, 4 R. Ryan Fitzgerald had 2 hits including a 2-run HR (\#1) and Pedro Castellanos went 3-for-4.

Lowell (4-4) - The Lowell Spinners (short-A) routed Tri-City, 11-4 last night. Tyler Esplin was 3-for-5 with a single, double, 3-run HR (\#2) and 5 RBI. Garrett Benge ( 2 hits, RBI, 3 runs) and Devlin Granberg (single, double, RBI, 2 runs) also had nice games. Rio Gomez tossed 2 innings of relief to get the win.

The PawSox are pleased to offer back-to-back firework nights at McCoy Stadium during the holiday week on Monday July $2^{\text {nd }}$ and Tuesday July $3^{\text {rd }}$ when the PawSox host games against Rochester both nights at $6: 15 \mathrm{pm}$. The July $2^{\text {nd }}$ post-game fireworks show is sponsored by Dave's Marketplace while the July $3^{\text {rd }}$ show is the traditional McCoy fireworks spectacular set to patriotic music.

PAWSOX PLAYER MOVES - The Boston Red Sox today recalled infielder Tzu-Wei Lin from Pawtucket and optioned lefthanded pitcher Robby Scott to Pawtucket. Scott has not yet been activated by the PawSox. The PawSox are now one under the roster limit with 24 active players (rehabbing reliever Tyler Thornburg does not count against the active roster).

Lin will be making his second appearance with the major league club this season, having gone 6-for-32 (.188) with two doubles in 14 games for Boston from April 10-May 3. He was batting . 188 for the PawSox through May 22, but he has since raised his batting average to .299 by going 40 -for- $116(.345)$ with 10 doubles and three home runs in his last 28 games, hitting safely in 25 of those, including in 16 consecutive games from May 27-June 14. Ranked by Baseball America as the No. 21 prospect in the Red Sox organization, Lin has spent his entire professional career in the Boston system since signing as an international free agent in June 2012. In 39 major league games since his 2017 debut, the infielder has hit .239 ( 21 -for-88) while making 13 starts at shortstop, six at third base, and five at second base.

Scott, who has not yet been added back on the PawSox roster, was recalled by the Red Sox on June 19 and made his lone major league appearance of the season that night at Minnesota, allowing two runs in 0.1 innings pitched. He has made 24 relief appearances for the PawSox this season, posting a 1.48 ERA (4 ER/24.1 IP) with 36 strikeouts, a 1.03 WHIP , and a .187 opponent batting average. Twenty of his 24 appearances have been scoreless, including 13 of his last 14 . Since May 5, Scott has posted a 0.61 ERA (1 ER/14.2 IP) while holding opponents to a . 137 batting average (7-for-51) and zero home runs. Signed by the Red Sox as a non-drafted free agent in 2011, he is 3-2 with a 3.64 ERA (17 ER/42.0 IP) in 65 career major league relief appearances (2016-18), having made his first career Opening Day roster with Boston in 2017.

Infielder Tzu-Wei Lin became the first player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston this season (not including rehabbing players) on April 10 before rejoining Pawtucket on May 8 and then returning to Boston on June 23. Marcus Walden was \#2 following his quick recall on April 12 and then another recall on May 2 (but he is now back with the PawSox). Bobby Poyner became the third call-up on May 4 - he later returned to Pawtucket, went back to Boston (May 15), back again with the PawSox, to Boston (June 2), and now returned to Pawtucket. 1B/OF Sam Travis became the fourth call-up on June 2 (now back with the PawSox), RHP Brandon Workman was next on June 5, LHP Jalen Beeks followed on June 6 (but has since returned to Pawtucket). RHP Justin Haley was the next call-up to Boston on June 8 but was optioned on June 19. LHP Robby Scott became the $8^{\text {th }}$ different player promoted to Boston on June 19 but was optioned to Pawtucket on June 23.

The PawSox have employed 9 different Red Sox players on a rehab assignment already this season...LHP Drew Pomeranz (back in Boston), RHP Steven Wright (twice but back in Boston), LHP Bobby Poyner (optioned to Pawtucket, recalled again to Boston, and now back with the PawSox), INF Xander Bogaerts (returned to Boston), RHP Tyler Thornburg (three times), INF/OF Brock Holt (back with Boston), 2B Dustin Pedroia (back with the Red Sox), RHP Austin Maddox (returned to Boston but remains on Red Sox DL), and RHP Hector Velazquez (returned to Boston).

It was another busy player movement year in 2017. The PawSox were involved in 221 player transactions during the 2017 season. Pawtucket employed 55 different players last season ( 28 pitchers \& 27 position players). They had 18 different players promoted to Boston during the 2017 season (not including rehabbing players).
