South Bend Cubs (2-0, 36-35) at Dayton Dragons (0-2, 31-39)

RH Rollie Lacy (2-1, 2.40) vs. RH Tyler Mondile (2-5, 6.46)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the South Bend Cubs (affiliate of the Chicago Cubs) in the third game of a four-game series. This is game three of the 2018 Second Half season.

Season Series to Date: Dayton 5, South Bend 3 (at Dayton: Dragons 3, Cubs 2). **Current Series to Date:** South Bend 2, Dayton 0.

Low Scoring Matchups: In all eight games played between Dayton and South Bend this season, the teams combined to score five runs or less. In seven of the eight games, the winning team scored three runs or less (winner scored four in the exception). Six of the eight games have been decided by one run.

Last Game: Friday: South Bend 3, Dayton 2. In a repeat of the final score from Thursday, South Bend held off the Dragons for a one-run decision. The Cubs scored three runs in the fourth before the Dragons pull to within a run with two in the fifth, but two Cubs relievers combined to shutout Dayton over the final four innings. Jeter Downs led the eight hit Dayton attack with two hits including a double and an RBI. Dragons starting pitcher Hunter Greene went a career-high six and two thirds innings, allowing five hits and three runs (two earned) with no walks and seven strikeouts.

2018 Team Notes

- The Dragons have been the streakiest team in professional baseball in 2018. They started the year with a three-game losing streak, won the next nine games, lost the next eight, won nine of 10, lost the next eight, won seven of eight, lost the next three, won four of six, lost the next seven, won two, and have lost the last six.
- The Dragons are 2-13 since June 3 when their record stood at 29-26. Six of the 13 losses have come by one run. Over the last 15 games, the team batting average is .215 (106-492) while the club has averaged 2.93 runs per game (44 R/15 G). The team ERA is 5.15 (129.1 IP, 74 ER).
- The Dragons have committed just five errors in their last 13 games.
- The Dragons have scored four runs or less in 13 consecutive games (last scored more than four in a game on June 6).
- The Dragons threatened to tie the franchise record for most home wins in a half (25) in the First Half, but came up short. They entered their final series, a four-game series with Bowling Green, with 22 home wins in the first half, but they were swept in the series.
- Meanwhile, the Dragons broke the club record for fewest road wins in a half. The club record was 10 road wins, and the Dragons finished with nine. The Dragons played three fewer road games in the first half than the scheduled number of 35 due to three postponements at Great Lakes in April.
- The Dragons team ERA in their 31 wins is 3.21 (278 IP, 99 ER). The ERA in the 39 losses is 6.94 (328.1 IP, 253 ER).
- The Dragons are 17-16 in one-run games, with 33 of their 70 games decided by one run. They are 23-1 when leading after eight innings (the only loss came June 5 at Lake County).
- The Dragons have come back to win four games in which they trailed by at least three runs including two in which they trailed by six runs. However they have also lost six games in which they led by at least three runs.
- The Dragons finished the First Half with a record of 31-37, in sixth place in the East Division.

2018 Individual Notes

- **Hunter Greene** over his last six starts: 30.1 IP, 25 H, 9 R, 8 ER, 7 BB, 34 SO, 2.37 ERA.
- **Cory Thompson** has posted a 1.72 ERA in 26 relief appearances. He has not allowed a run over his last five outings covering nine innings (he also struck out the only batter he faced in the MWL All-Star Game on Tuesday at Lansing).
- **John Ghyzel** is tied for first in the MWL lead in saves with 12. Ghyzel was the winning pitcher in the MWL All-Star Game on Tuesday.
- **Montrell Marshall** was selected as the MVP of Tuesday's MWL All-Star Game. Marshall drove in the winning run in the bottom of the 10th inning to give the East Division team a 3-2 victory. Dragons reliever John Ghyzel pitched a scoreless top of the 10th for the East despite starting the inning with the mandatory runner at second base.

- Five members of the Dragons played in the Midwest League All-Star Game in Lansing on June 19. They are C **Hendrik Clementina** (started as the DH), OF **Stuart Fairchild** (since promoted to Daytona), 1B **Montrell Marshall**, RHP **John Ghyzel**, RHP **Cory Thompson**.
- Four members of the Dragons are rated among the Reds top 30 prospects (*Baseball America*). They are RHP **Hunter Greene** (#2); INF **Jeter Downs** (#11); INF **Jose Garcia** (#12); and LHP **Packy Naughton** (#28).
- RHP **Hunter Greene** is one of 16 first round draft picks to play for the Dragons. He was the second overall pick in the 2017 draft out of Notre Dame High School in Sherman Oaks, California.
- Dragons catcher **Mark Kolozsvary** was a member of the 2017 NCAA national championship team at the University of Florida.

The Dragons MVP Program

The Dragons expanded elementary school MVP Program reaches five counties and more than 1,100 classrooms. Schools in Montgomery, Greene, Clark, Miami and Warren counties are part of the program that includes 1,116 fourth and fifth grade classrooms in 183 schools over 48 school districts. About 34,000 children will participate. The program is in its 13th year in 2018.
