Delayed Starts: -Suspensions: 1 Postponements: 3 Cancelled: 1 <u>LITTLE STREAK</u>: Outfielder **Grant Little** has hit safely in 6 consecutive games. He's 7-for-20 (.350 AVG) with 5 walks (.480 OBP) and only 1 strikeout. This comes on the heels of an 0-for-22 stretch from April 25-May 3.

<u>HUNTING HITS:</u> Blake Hunt has the 14th lowest K% in the MWL (15%), but also the 11th lowest BABIP (.235). A typical BABIP is about .300.

CHANGE IN APPROACH: Infielder Luis Almanzar has walked in 15% of his plate appearances this season. That's the 15th highest BB% in the MWL. It's also a jump from his 9% BB% in 63 games with the TinCaps in 2018. That said, Almanzar's K% has risen as well from 31% last year to 35% this year (12th highest in the league).

<u>WALK & RUN</u>: Outfielder **Jawuan Harris** has walked in 19% of his plate appearances this season. That's the 3rd highest BB% in the MWL (and a jump from 14% for him last year as a rookie). Harris is also tied for 6th in Runs (23).

RUIZ RIPPING IT: Outfielder Agustin Ruiz is 5th in the MWL in RBIs (25) and 8th in Doubles (11). Ruiz has a 28% Line Drive % on batted balls — 4th highest in the MWL.

IN CONTROL: TinCaps pitchers have walked the fewest batters in the MWL this year (116 BB in 313.1 IP, 3.3 BB/9). Starters **Gabe Mosser** (1.51 BB/9, 4th lowest in the MWL) and **Efraín Contreras** (2.25 BB/9, 9th lowest) have best epitomized that.

MORE NOTES

200: Anthony Contreras, who's in his 4th season as the team's skipper, won his 200th game as TinCaps manager on April 11. His win total now stands at 209. The franchise leader in that category is **Doug Dascenzo** (227, 2007-09). **Randy Ready** (2004-06) ranks 2nd with 209 victories.

<u>FOREVER YOUNG</u>: The average age for a TinCaps position player thus far has been 20.1, the youngest in the Midwest League (MWL average: 21.2). The average age for a 'Caps pitcher is 20.9, also the youngest (MWL average: 21.9). This marks the 6th consecutive year Fort Wayne has had the league's most youthful lineup, going back to 2014. The TinCaps had the youngest pitching staff in the league in 2016 and ranked tied for 2nd youngest in '18, 2nd youngest in '12, '13, and '17.

260 TO THE SHOW: 181 former Fort Wayne players have reached the big leagues since the franchise was founded in 1993. 8 'Caps alums have broken through this year with SS Fernando Tatis Jr., RHP Chris Paddack, LHP Nick Margevicius, RHP Pedro Avila, RHP Gerardo Reyes, INF Ty France and C Austin Allen appearing for the Padres, plus INF Josh VanMeter with the Reds.

<u>WELCOME BACK</u>: 14 of the team's 25 players appeared in at least 1 game with the TinCaps last year: INF Luis Almanzar, LHP Joey Cantillo, LHP Dan Dallas, INF Nick Feight, C Juan Fernandez, RHP Nick Kuzia, RHP Henry Henry, INF Justin Lopez, RHP Adrian Martinez, RHP Gabe Mosser, RHP Jose Quezada, OF Agustin Ruiz, LHP Ryan Weathers, and RHP Carlos Belen, who was a corner infield with the 'Caps in 2016 and '18.

IN THE DUGOUT: Anthony Contreras is back for his 4th season as TinCaps manager, becoming the first skipper in the franchise's 27-year history to lead the team for more than 3 years... Hitting coach Jonathan Mathews (2nd season), fielding coach Jhonny Carvajal (3rd), athletic trainer Allyse Kramer (3rd), and strength coach Sam Hoffman (2nd) are also back. Matt Williams is the team's new pitching coach, succeeding Burt Hooton—the club's pitching coach for the last 6 seasons—who's missing the season as he recovers from knee surgery in March.

<u>PADRES ON DECK</u>: MLB.com, Baseball America, and ESPN have rated San Diego's farm system as baseball's best. The 'Caps have 4 players on MLB.com's Top 30 list for the Pads (see list on Page 1). Not to be overlooked, ESPN's Keith Law ranks INF **Justin Lopez** at No. 19. He also notes RHP **Efraín Contreras** as another to watch with OF **Agustin Ruiz** & LHP **Joey Cantillo**.

<u>VAMOS TINCAPS</u>: A team of Padres minor league prospects ventured to Mexico City to play the Diablos Rojos del México and open up Estadio Alfredo Harp Helú, which is named after a member of the Padres' ownership team, with a pair of games March 23-24. Both games drew a sell-out crowd of 20,000+ fans and Mexican President **Andrés Manuel López Obrador** threw out the ceremonial first pitch. LHP **Ryan Weathers** started Game 1, while RHP **Efrain Contreras** and **Adrian Martinez** also pitched, joined by catcher **Blake Hunt**, infielders **Xavier Edwards**, **Justin Lopez**, **Tucupita Marcano**, and outfielders **Grant Little** and **Agustin Ruiz**. The Padres on Deck team impressively won both games.

2018 IN REVIEW: The 2018 TinCaps missed out on reaching the Midwest League Playoffs by a game. In fact, it came down to the final day of the regular season on Labor Day, as the TinCaps and West Michigan Whitecaps were in a tie for the Eastern Division's second-half wild card. Ultimately, Fort Wayne fell in extra innings, 3-2. The TinCaps finished the season with an overall record of 64-74 (32-37 in both halves). Nevertheless, the TinCaps featured one of the most prospect-laden teams in Minor League Baseball. The squad included the MWL's Left-Handed Pitcher of the Year in Osvaldo Hernandez as well as Left-Handed Reliever of the Year Travis Radke. Radke and fellow lefties Nick Margevicius and Aaron Leasher, along with catcher Luis Campusano, were all MWL Mid-Season All-Stars. Other top prospects with the club during the year were LHP MacKenzie Gore, RHP Luis Patiño, OF Tirso Ornelas, OF Jeisson Rosario, INF Gabriel Arias, INF Owen Miller, and INF Esteury Ruiz. The team's pitching staff had the lowest walk rate in the league (2.9 / 9 IP) and the best strikeout to walk ratio (3.13).

<u>CAPS ON MILB.TV</u>: For the first time, this season TinCaps home games are available to watch on MiLB.TV (in addition to being broadcast around Indiana for Xfinity customers on Comcast Network 81). Fans can save \$10 on their subscription by using the promo code TINCAPS.

ON THE FRANCHISE: The franchise was founded in 1993 as the Fort Wayne Wizards. The team was affiliated with the Minnesota Twins from 1993-98. The organization has been affiliated with the San Diego Padres since '99. The Wizards played at Memorial Stadium, about 3.5 miles north of Downtown Fort Wayne. The team moved into Parkview Field in 2009 and rebranded as the TinCaps, paying homage to John Chapman aka Johnny Appleseed, who's buried in Fort Wayne.

Former President Barack Obama took winter vacations in Kailua every year from 2008-2012... The hit television show Lost was filmed in Kailua from 2004-2010... Kailua has produced 3 former MLB players (Scott Feldman, Sid Fernandez, & Kila Ka'aihue)... Yes, Joey surfs.
- FAVORITE ATHLETE: Clayton Kershaw (Also a 6-4 left-handed pitcher; Kershaw is listed at 228 as opposed to Cantillo's 225)
- JOLTIN' JOE: Joey was, in part, named after Joe DiMaggio... Joey's dad, Johnny, is from Smithtown, New York, on Long Island and his favorite player was Joe DiMaggio. Joey's grandfather on his mom's side was named Joseph, so the parents decided to go with Joseph and Joey as nickname... When Joey was young, he grew up as a Yankees fan because of his dad... Once Joey started getting into baseball at an older age, the family had Oceanic Cable, the Dodgers Channel, so Joey started to become a Dodgers fan while growing up.
