Season Finale... The San Jose Giants conclude the 2018 season today with the finale of a four-game series against the Modesto Nuts at Municipal Stadium. The Nuts have won two out of the first three games in the current series claiming victories of 3-1 on Friday and 7-0 yesterday. The Giants won a 9-8 decision on Saturday. Carlos Sano (4-5, 4.09 ERA) is slated to make the start on the mound for San Jose today.

The Giants... San Jose is 1-5 during their current homestand (0-3 vs. Stockton, 1-2 vs. Modesto) and have lost nine out of their last 11 games overall. The Giants' 81 losses this year are the third-most in a single-season in the 31-year history of the team (53-87 in 2000, 58-82 in 2003).

Team Awards... The Giants will announce their team MVP in a ceremony before today's game. Team award winners this season include Logan Webb (Pitcher of the Year), Wander Franco and Heath Quinn (co-Offensive Players of the Year), Bryce Johnson (Defensive Player of the Year), Patrick Ruotolo and Nolan Riggs (co-Relief Pitchers of the Year) and Dylan Rheault (Good Guy Award).

League Leaderboard... Several Giants hitters currently rank among the California League leaders. Heath Quinn is sixth in the league in batting average (.299) and sixth in OPS (.862). Wander Franco is second in doubles (39) and sixth in hits (142). Jalen Miller is tied for fourth in doubles (35) and fifth in extra-base hits (51). Gio Brusa is tied for fifth in home runs (19) and ninth in RBI's (70). Johneshwy Fargas leads the league in stolen bases (47) while Bryce Johnson is fourth (31).

Miller Named Postseason All-Star... Jalen Miller has been named to the postseason California League All-Star team. Miller was San Jose's lone selection to the team. The former third round draft pick is batting .276 with 35 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 62 RBI's and 11 stolen bases in 122 games. Miller is currently rated the #23 prospect in the San Francisco organization by *MLB.com* and was also a midseason California League All-Star. Miller entered 2018 with a career .224 batting average over his first three professional seasons.

Inside The Record... The Giants have clinched the worst overall record in the California League this season. It's the second consecutive year that San Jose will finish with the worst record in the league (62-78 in '17). Prior to last season, the Giants posted the worst record in the league only once in their first 29 years (1997). San Jose is 19-40 (.322) since July 1, 29-56 (.341) since the beginning of June and 36-66 (.353) since achieving their high-water mark of seven games above .500 on May 13 (22-15). The Giants are only 13-29 in their last 42 home games dating back to June 2 (after starting the season 17-10 at home). For the first time in team history (1988-2018), San Jose will finish with a sub-.500 overall record for three straight seasons (62-78 in 2017, 68-72 in 2016).

No Playoffs... The Giants will miss the playoffs in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2002-03. Prior to the current two-year drought (2017-18), the Giants reached the playoffs 12 times in 13 seasons from 2004-2016.

Climbing The Charts... Gio Brusa has hit 36 career home runs with the San Jose Giants, which is tied for fourth in team-history (Travis Ishikawa, Angel Villalona) and the most ever by a switch hitter. His 36 homers have come over 220 games with San Jose the last two seasons (17 HR in 2017, 19 HR in 2018). Wander Franco's 39 doubles this year rank fifth on the SJ Giants single-season list. Only four players in club history have hit 40+ doubles in a season (Mark Leonard 50, Eddy Martinez-Esteve 44, Thomas Neal 41, Devin Harris 40).

2019 Season... The Giants open the 2019 season on Thursday, April 4 in Visalia. San Jose begins next year with a seven-game road trip against the Rawhide and Stockton Ports. The Giants home opener is Thursday, April 11 against Visalia. 2019 will mark San Jose's 32nd season as an affiliate of the San Francisco Giants.

* Has lost his last two starts allowing six runs in both outings ... Most recent start came on August 29 against Stockton ... Pitched five innings with six runs (all earned) allowed ... Gave up seven hits, walked none and struck out eight (one off season-high) ... Tagged for six runs (four earned) over 4 2/3 innings in his previous start on August 24 at Modesto.

* Is 0-2 with an 8.56 ERA (13 ER/13.2 IP) in four appearances (one start) versus Modesto this season.

* Allowed two runs or fewer in five consecutive starts from July 27-August 18.

* Struck out a career-high nine on August 18 against Lancaster ... Allowed just one run on three hits over six innings.

* Owns a .235 opponents batting average (.224 vs. right, .248 vs. left).

* Opponents are batting .171 against him when leading off an inning and .205 with the bases empty ... Has a .319 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position.

* Has a 3.54 ERA and .186 opponents batting average at home (4.65 ERA, .280 AVG on road).

* Was added to San Jose's roster on May 21 from Augusta (A) ... Made two relief appearances with the GreenJackets before receiving a promotion ... Tossed five scoreless innings with one hit allowed and seven strikeouts in Augusta ... Made his season debut on May 10 after opening the year at Extended Spring Training.

* Pitched in the Nicaraguan Professional League last season for the Rivas Giants ... Had a 2.86 ERA over 11 appearances (two starts) ... Struck out 21 and walked 10 in 22 innings.
