LATE BIG INNING FOR SALEM TOO MUCH FOR ROCKS: The Wilmington Blue Rocks had a late rally by the Salem Red Sox get the better of them on Sunday afternoon with the Rocks taking the loss by a final score of 7-4 at Frawley Stadium. Wilmington's starter Gerson Garabito had another quality outing on the mound. The right-hander went seven innings, giving up only three hits, two runs, and three walks while also fanning five batters. Gabriel Cancel drove in three of the four runs and picked up a pair of doubles and a home run in the setback.
CAN COUNT ON CANCEL: Infielder Gabriel Cancel has been a major run producer for the Blue Rocks over the last 30 games.
-With three more runs driven in on Sunday, Cancel has now driven in 34 runs during that stretch.
-Cancel has also put together 11 multi-RBI games during the stretch and leads the team with 14 games driving in multiple runs.
-He currently is the team leader in RBI with 54 and second in the Royals' system.
-Cancel has driven in 14 runs in 12 games this month.
-The 21-year-old slashed .333/.380/.478 in the month of June with three homers and 26 RBI.

POWER SURGE: With Gabriel Cancel's two-run homer in Sunday's loss, the Rocks have now clubbed seven home runs over their last eight games.
-Meibry's Viloria hit a solo home run in Wilmington's 16-1 win on Saturday.
-Blake Perkins and Rudy Martin both homered Wednesday night at Frederick.
-Nick Heath's leadoff home run to start Tuesday's game was the first leadoff long ball hit by a Blue Rock since Nicky Lopez also did it at Frederick on May 22, 2017.
-It was the second homer of the season for Heath with his first being an inside-the-park homer at Frawley Stadium against Myrtle Beach on May 17.
-In the series opener at Frederick on July $\dot{9}$, the Blue Rocks hit back-to-back homers with D.J. Burt and Emmanuel Rivera achieving the feat for the first time since June 2, 2017 at Winston-Salem when
Brandon Downes and Chris DeVito hit consecutive home runs with DeVito's completing his cycle.
-Burt's homer was his first of the season and first since August 10, 2016 when he was with Lexington.
OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION: The Blue Rocks put together their best offensive game of the season in the second game of the series against Salem on Saturday night.
-The 20 hits set a new single-game season high and was three shy of matching a franchise record for most hits in a game.
-Wilmington smacked 23 hits on April 18, 1999 at Myrtle Beach in a 20-3 win over the Pelicans.
-The 16 runs scored also set a new watermark this season and were the most run scored by the Blue Rocks since May 18, 2013 when the Blue Crew scored 18 runs in an 18-5 win in the second game of a doubleheader at Frederick.
-The previous high was 15 runs back on April 19, also at Frederick, when Wilmington scored all 15 runs -The previous high was 15 r
-Seven different Blue Rocks had multi-hit efforts with Nick Heath leading the way with four hits.
STARTERS SETTING THE TONE: In their last 19 games, the Blue Rock's starting pitching has been very strong.
-The starting staff has allowed 39 earned runs over the last 109.1 innings of work to yield a solid 3.21 ERA. -During those 19 starts, the Blue Rocks' hurlers have turned in eight quality starts and have allowed two earned runs or less in 13 of them.
-The Rocks are 10-9 through those 19 games.
ROCKS OFF AND RUNNING: The Blue Rocks have wasted no time getting back into base stealing mode as they have stolen 34 bases through the first 22 games of the second half.
-With Nick Heath stealing two bags on Sunday, the Blue Rocks have matched their stolen base total from last season with 111.
-Wilmington has four different active players with double-digit stolen bases including Heath who leads the team, Royals' system and Carolina League with 28 in just 52 games, D.J Burt is second with 22, newcomer Blake Perkins has 17 between Potomac and Wilmington and Rudy Martin has 14 stolen bases on the year.
-The Blue Crew have stolen five bases in four different games this season.
-Wilmington is the only team in the Carolina League to steal 20 or more bases in each of the first three months of the season. ( 37 in April, 20 in May and 37 in June, currently have 17 in July.)
-On the season, the Rocks are second in the Carolina League with 108 stolen bases trailing Buies Creek. ( 117 SB ) -They also have an impressive $72 \%$ success rate steating bases this season ( 111 out of 155 ).

HEATH LIVING ON THE BASES: Nick Heath pushed his season-high on-base streak to 16 games after drawing a pair of walks on Sunday.
-It is the third-Iongest active streak in the Carolina League and second-longest by a Blue Rock this season. (Khalil Lee 18 games from May 25 - June 12)

-During the stretch, Heath is hitting . 293 ( 17 -for- 58 ) with 12 walks.
-Among qualified Blue Rocks, the speedy outfielder is third on the team with a .394 on-base percentage
BURT PROVIDING THE HURT: Second-year Blue Rock D.J. Burt is not suffering from a sophomore slump in the Carolina League and was named a Carolina League All-Star.
-He is second in the Carolina League in stolen bases (22), third in on-base percentage (.400) and fifth in batting average (.306)
-Hit his first homer of the season and first since August 10, 2016 Monday night at Frederick.
-Had 11-game on-base streak come to an end on July 5. He hit . 417 (15-for-36) with an OBP\% of . 533 during the span.
-He has also picked up a hit in seven straight (.355, 11-for-31) games and in 21 of his last 27 games.
-Tied for team-lead with 23 multi-hit games. (Had 20 all of last season)
-The 22-year-old has served as the Rocks' utility man this season, making 24 starts at third base, 16 at second

## Pitch Repertoire: Fastball, Slider, Curveball and Changeup

THE BOOK ON NOLAN WATSON: Was the 33rd overall pick in the 2015 Draft by the Royals as Kansas City received the pick as compensation when James Shields signed with the San Diego Padres that offseason. Was a highly-touted high school prep pitcher and went 6-1 with an impressive 0.68 ERA in 51.2 innings of work while striking out 81 batters during his senior year. He was committed to Vanderbilt University before signing with the Royals for a reported $\$ 1.8$ million. Joins former prep arms in Ashe Russell, who was selected 21st overall in 2015, Foster Griffin (2014) and Scott Blewett (2014) as other top two round picks by the Royals during the 2014-15 MLB Drafts. Played against Russell in high school as Watson's North Lawrence High School team beat Russell's Cathedral High School in the state tournament.

LAST TIME OUT: Watson is coming off a winning effort in his last start on July 10 at Frederick. His seven innings of work were the most for the right-hander since joining Wilmington and he allowed three runs (all earned) scattered 10 hits, walked one and struck out three. It was his second-career AdvancedA win.

ADJUSTING TO NEW ROUTINE: Like many players who get drafted in the MLB Draft, Watson was a talented player on his high school team and played multiple positions, listing playing shortstop and being a designated hitter as his two favorite positions aside from pitching. However, Watson has realized that the schedule and preparation from being a high-school athlete to a professional athlete has major differences. "Just the preparation throughout the week," Watson said. "In high school, I played every position and hit and everything. I wasn't really focused on taking care of my arm because I had a whole six days of rest to recover but here, I have to do the most with my time, the little time that I have to prepare throughout the whole week. I'd say just judging how you feel each day, doing what you need to do that day is probably the hardest part."

BETTER COMPETITION IN CAROLINA LEAGUE: In addition to his routine to get himself ready for each start, Watson also has realized quickly how advanced the approach is at the plate for hit ters in Advanced-A. "The approach. I can't just go out there and throw two fastballs on the corner and then throw a curveball in the dirt to get a strikeout. I've had problems getting strikeouts since I've been here because I have to get used to the way hitters approach their at-bats now. I'm not too worried about it. It's just an adjustment I need to make in the bullpen. But I'm confident I won't have a problem with that much longer."
NAMED AFTER THE RYAN EXPRESS: Watson's parents named him after an all-time pitching great in Nolan Ryan. "There was a poster on my brother's wall when he was real young, and it was a poster of Nolan Ryan and it said, "Read More Books". My mom told me she just looked at that poster every day and said "If we have another boy we're naming him Nolan." So it happened. I have no idea when I figured out who Nolan Ryan was, but I guess the day that I did, I fell in love."
A FAN OF MULTIPLE PLAYERS GROWING UP: Along with listing Nolan Ryan as one of his favorite players, Watson also had two other players he grew up watching. "I also really liked Jose Reyes and Alfonso Soriano." When asked why he liked Alfonso Soriano Watson said, "I think my parents gave me one of those little Macfarlane figures and I had that in my room and I just liked him ever since. I had his Cubs jersey, I had a Cubs hat. I started liking Jose Reyes because he was my brother's favorite player Anything my brother did, I wanted to do as well because he was older. I just wanted to look up to him, if he did something or liked somebody, I liked him too."

GOALS FOR THE REST OF THE SEASON: Happy to be in Wilmington, Watson wants to put together a strong finish to the 2018 season. "I want to continue what I'm doing now, get better with my command and my delivery. Just working on getting everything together and staying healthy."
