

TRENTON THUNDER GAME NOTES

Bowie Baysox ((Orioles) vs. Trenton Thunder ((Yankees))

LAST GAME:

A five-RBI performance by rehabbing Yankee Thairo Estrada helped spark a pair of early Thunder rallies on Friday night at ARM & HAMMER Park as the Thunder defeated the Reading Fightin Phils, 12-2, to sweep the Eastern League Division Series, three games to none.

The Thunder staged a five-run rally in the third off two Fightins relievers to earn the win. With the bases loaded, Kyle Holder scored from third base on a third-strike wild pitch to Rashad Crawford, Estrada lined a rare three-run single off the glove of diving shortstop Nick Maton, and Ruta capped the romp with an RBI-single for a 10-1 Thunder lead.

Severino, meanwhile, struck out five batters over three-plus innings, leaving after walking the leadoff man in the fourth. Matt Wivinin entered in relief and retired three Reading batters in a row to retire the side and turn the reins over to Yankees reliever Dellin Betances, also on rehab assignment. Betances pitched a scoreless fifth, stranding a pair of runners after a hit batter and a two-out walk.

Estrada's five RBI in the game matched Zoilo Almonte's franchise record for most RBI in a postseason game, set in 2013. Along with Estrada, four other Thunder players recorded multiple hits. Albert Abreu, oks Kriske, and Daniel Alvarez combined for the final four innings of relief for the Thunder, with a Nick Maton RBI-single off Kriske in the eighth producing the final Reading run.

THUNDER CLAPS

GUESS WHO'S BACK: This is the Thunder's third trip to the Eastern League Championship Series in four years and the eighth overall in franchise history (series wins in 2007, 2008, and 2013). Bowie, meanwhile, has made just one previous trip to the ELCS, defeating Reading in a full five games in 2015. The Thunder and Baysox have never met in a championship series.

SEPARATE WAYS (WORLDS APART): The Thunder clinched the first-half Eastern Division title with a 38-28 record while the Baysox struggled to a 30-38 finish (5th place) in the first half. Bowie, however, recovered to clinch the second-half Western Division title (46-26) while Trenton finished just four games over .500 (38-34) in the second half.

GOOD VIBES: Last week's ELDS sweep of Reading was the fourth division series sweep in Thunder franchise history. Two of Trenton's three previous ELDS sweeps preceded a league title for the team: 2008 (3-0 over Portland in ELDS, 3-1 over Akron in ELCS) and 2013 (3-0 over Binghamton in ELDS, 3-0 over Harrisburg in ELCS).

THE OUTLIERS: As a team, the Thunder batted just .215 against Bowie this season, the lowest average for Trenton against any team in 2019. Still, three Thunder players enjoyed considerable success against Baysox pitching: **Rashad Crawford** (.357 AVG in 5G), **Kyle Holder** (.353 AVG, 3 RBI in 6G), and **Chris Gittens** (2 HR, 5 RBI in 6G).

WHAT A RELIEF: The Thunder bullpen, one of the Eastern League's best during the regular season, dominated the ELDS with a 0.48 ERA and a 0.54 WHIP. The bullpen's totals: 18.2 IP, 5 H (0 XBH), 2 R (1 ER), 5 BB, 29 K.

BRINGIN' HOME THE BLING: On August 29, **Chris Gittens** was named the Eastern League's Most Valuable Player, becoming the second player in Thunder franchise history to earn such honors (Brandon Laird took home league MVP honors in 2010). Additionally, Gittens was named to the Eastern League Postseason All-Star team. Gittens is the 16th player in Thunder franchise history to be named to both the Mid-Season and Post-Season All-Star Teams. 2019 marks the 4th consecutive season that the Thunder have had a player named to both teams following LHP Jordan Montgomery and SS Tyler Wade in 2016, SS Thairo Estrada in 2017 and OF Trey Amburgey in 2018. Nomar Garciaparra was the first to earn the dual honor in 1995.

NEW HEIGHTS: Many Thunder players set new career-highs in various categories this season. Among position players: **Chris Gittens** set career-highs in hits (112), home runs (23), RBI (77), and walks (71)... **Max Burt:** 80 hits, 8 home runs, 38 RBI... **Rashad Crawford:** 7 HR... **Kyle Holder:** 25 2B, 3 3B, 9 HR, 41 BB... **Isiah Gilliam:** 17 HR, 13 SB... **Brian Navarrete:** 6 HR... **Hoy Jun Park:** 113 hits, 20 doubles, 41 RBI... **Ben Ruta:** 26 2B, 55 RBI, 47 walks. Among pitchers: **Daniel Alvarez:** 47 G, 21 SV, and 76 K... **Rony Garcia:** 25G/24GS, 130.1 IP, 129 K... **Brooks Kriske:** 43 G, 60.2 IP, 12 SV, 80 K... **Shawn Semple:** 26 G/20 GS, 127.0 IP, 121 K.

YEAR OF THE PITCHER: The Eastern League had one of its most pitching-dominant seasons in its history in 2019, with a league-wide batting average of .238 with teams scoring 3.92 runs per game. The last time the league finished with a team batting average under .250 and 4.0 runs per game was in 1989 (.249 / 3.95), while 1971 was the last season below .240 and fewer than 4.0 runs per game. The league also saw eight no-hitters thrown, the most since a league-record nine no-hitters were thrown in 1967.

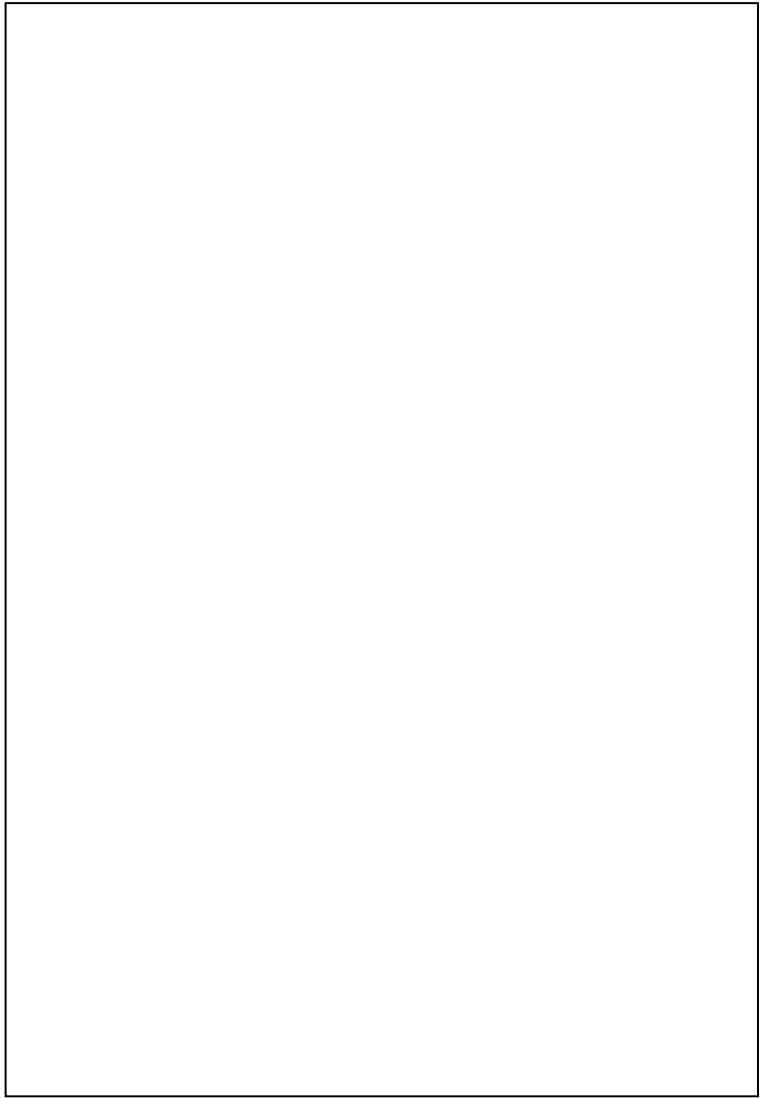

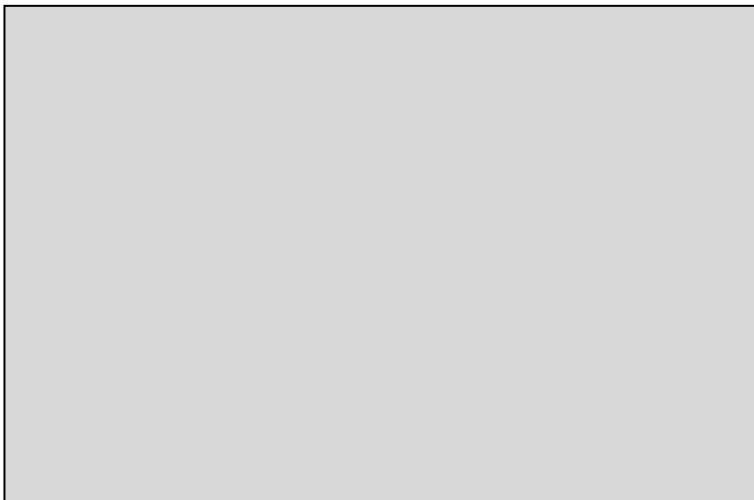

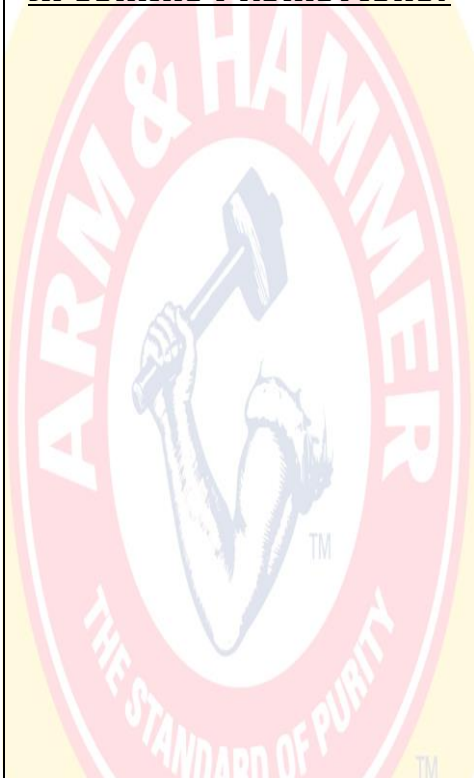
