RAILRIDERS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 29-15 | AWAY: 27-19 | STREAK: W 1 | LAST 5: 3-2 | LAST 10: 7-3

LAST TIME OUT: The RailRiders returned from the All-Star Break with a 6-1 drubbing of the Buffalo Bisons at Coca-Cola Field on Thursday night. The RailRiders have won 23 of their last 33 and seven of nine, while the Bisons have lost 30 of their last 37 including nine straight versus SWB. The RailRiders have outscored Buffalo, 43-9, during their nine-game run of dominance.

QUALITY & QUANTITY: SWB starter **Luis Cessa (4-6)** fired his fourth straight quality start at Triple-A to get the win. Over those four outings Cessa has fired 26 innings, allowing 19 hits, five runs and four walks against 23 strikeouts (1.73 ERA, .207 BAA, 0.88 WHIP). Including his most recent stint in the bigs, Cessa has not allowed a run over his last three outings, a span of 12.2 scoreless innings. Last night he tossed six scoreless innings giving up six hits (five singles), walking one and whiffing six. The lone extra-base hit (Rowdy Tellez's double) came against the grain of a shift. He breezed through his six innings on just 67 pitches (44 strikes), facing 22 batters (3.05 pitches/batter) with one double play.

SAVE ME: **Brady Lail** hurled the last three innings for his second career save, both at Buffalo's expense. He gave up a solo homer to Jon Berti in the seventh, but allowed no other baserunners and retired the final seven he faced in succession.

I'M JUST A CAVE MAN: **Jake Cave** ended the night 1-for-4 with two RBIs, one walk and one run scored. He has hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games. He finished 3-for-3 and recorded his first career two-homer game on Saturday with a career-best five RBIs. The MVP of the Governors' Cup Championship Series in 2016, Cave has gone 29-for-90 with SWB, posting 13 extra-base hits (seven home runs), 16 RBIs and 17 runs scored while slashing .322/.378/.633/1.011. Cave entered 2017 with 19 career round-trippers. He has 12 between Double-A Trenton (5) and SWB this year.

SOL MAN: **Donovan Solano** went 2-for-4 with a double, an RBI, a walk and two runs scored. He ended May hitting .164 overall. Since the start of June, he has reached safely in 32 of his 35 games played and owns a .344/.389/.443/.832 line in that time. During the spurt he has 10 doubles and 16 RBIs, lifting his average by over 110 points to .279.

B-MAC: **Billy McKinney** smacked his fourth Triple-A homer on Sunday. In his 11 Triple-A affairs, he has gone 16-for-43 with six extra-base hits (four homers), eight RBIs, nine runs scored and an outfield assist, slashing .372/.413/.721/1.134. McKinney has more three-hit games (3) than hitless games (2) at Triple-A.

SWIPER, NO SWIPING!: SWB leads the IL in caught-stealing efficiency at 45% (33 of 73 caught). **Eddy Rodriguez** stands as the IL's top catcher in the category. With Rodriguez behind the plate, SWB has nabbed 20 men in 37 attempts (54%). The IL's average caught-stealing efficiency minus SWB stands at 31%. No IL catcher has finished a season with a better caught-stealing rate since Rochester's Corky Miller ended the 2005 season at an IL-best 62%. At the time, a catcher needed just 10 attempts against to qualify and he nabbed 16 in 26 tries. The standard was changed to catching at least 50% of the team's total number of games in 2007. No IL team has ended a season with a number better than SWB's current rate since the 2005 Charlotte Knights caught 70 men in 146 attempts (48%).

OFF THE RAILS: SWB's offense ranks among the IL's best in: R/G (1st, 4.94), AVG (1st, .274), OBP (1st, .341), SLG (1st, .447), OPS (1st, .788), 2B (1st, 187), 3B (1st, 26), HR (3rd, 95) and SB (3rd, 77)...SWB pitching ranks among the IL's best in ERA (2nd, 3.46), WHIP (1st, 1.20) and K/9IP (2nd, 9.1)...SWB is undefeated in extra-inning games (6-0)...Only Columbus (7-0) has a better mark in the IL...At 15-6 (.714), the RailRiders boast the IL's best record in one-run games...No IL team has more wins when trailing after seven (6) or eight innings (4) than the RailRiders...SWB is the IL's only team undefeated when leading after seven frames (47-0) and one of five squads with unblemished records when in command after eight innings (43-0)... All nine RailRiders in the order reached base safely with a hit and/or a walk...**Mason Williams** went 3-for-5 with his second triple and scored a run...In nine games as SWB's leadoff man, Williams has slashed .316/.366/.447/.813...**Miguel Andujar** finished 2-for-4 with a solo homer and two runs scored...Two of Andujar's three homers have come over his last three games.

ON THE BUMP: **Dietrich Enns** began '14 w/A+ TAM, going 3-2, 1.42 w/26K in 25.1IP before TJ. In '15: 13G/12GS between R/A+ in '15: 2-1, 0.61, 0.90 WHIP, 8.4K/9IP. The AA EL Apr. '16 POM did not allow a run over 4GS: 3-0, 23.2IP, 9H (.120 BAA), 13BB, 25K. He began the '16 w/a TRE-record 24.1 scoreless IP, breaking Alfredo Aceves' season-opening record (19IP, '08). He had a CH 1IK in 6IP vs. Akron on Apr. 22 '16. He finished '16 w/SWB, posting 6GS during his 14G/10GS (7-2, 1/1SV, .208 BAA, 1.12 WHIP). In 4G/2GS vs. BUF in '16: 2-0, 17/1SV, 15.2IP, 7H, 0R, 2BB, 13K, .140 BAA, 0.57 WHIP. In 3GS vs. BUF '17: 0-0, 1.59, .158, 0.76. He ranked among MiLB's '16 full-season best in: wins (T-3rd, 14) & ERA (2nd, 1.73).

Cesar Valdez has MLB time w/ARI/OAK/TOR (15G/3GS, 1-2, 7.75, .329, 1.90). Mostly w/BUF since early May, he won his BUF debut at SYR May 10 (5IP, 0H, 0R, 1BB, 2K). After 5G/4GS w/BUF: 2-0, 3.38, 0.94, .221. In 5GS since: 1-3, 3.55, 1.30, .278, allowing 4R three times. He comes off a July 6 ND at SWB (7IP, 7H, 0R, 1BB, 3K, 1HB). His TOR outings came in relief May 20 at BAL and June 22 at TEX. He also has time this season w/OAK (4G/1GS, 0-0, 9.64, .350, 1.93) and AAA Nashville (2GS, 1-0, 2.70, .211, 0.80). During his MiLB rise w/ARI he was an A+ CAL AS in '08. Away from stateside baseball from 2012-15, he was a MEX AS in 2015 w/Tabasco (23GS, 11-6, 2.63, .240, 1.08).

SOUTH OF THE BORDER: Buffalo has fielded a Triple-A baseball team since 1985. It was the top satellite of the White Sox from 1985-86, the Indians in 1987 and the Pirates from 1988-94 before it switched back to the Indians (1995-08). In 2009, the Bisons claimed an Empire State squad as their parent club in the Mets. But change came calling again as 2013 marked the first season that the closest Major League city sent its top minor leaguers to Buffalo. In April 2016, the Blue Jays renewed their PDC with the Bisons through the 2018 season. Rogers Centre, home of the Blue Jays, is just a 90-minute drive from Coca-Cola Field (not including customs-related delays).

CALLING THE SHOTS: First-year Buffalo skipper **Bobby Meacham** spent his entire six-year playing career in the bigs with the New York Yankees (1983-88). He slashed .236/.313/.308/.621 over 457 career games and 1,591 plate appearances. His lone season with over 400 at-bats came in 1985 when he slashed .218/.302/.266/.568 as the team's primary shortstop and by far led the bigs with 23 sacrifice hits. His teammate, **Don Mattingly**, claimed A.L. MVP honors as the Yankees won 97 games for the junior circuit's second-best record, but fell 2.0 games shy of the first-place Toronto Blue Jays for the A.L. East crown. It made for Toronto's first division title. The Yankees hadn't won a division crown since 1981 and would not win another until 1996. Two big pieces of that 1996 team spent time with those 1985 Blue Jays, **Cecil Fielder** and **Jimmy Key**. Also, one of Toronto's catchers that season, who saw time in just 14 games in his final season as a big league player? Meacham's predecessor as Buffalo manager, **Gary Allenson**.
