Last Game: A bold new era of Jacksonville baseball history started with a victory for the Jumbo Shrimp (1-0) in its first ever game, topping the Mississippi Braves (0-1) 7-2 on Opening Night at Trustmark Park in Pearl, Mississippi on Thursday. Marlins No. 5 prospect Dillon Peters (1-0) earned the win as Jacksonville's starting left-handed pitcher worked five innings allowing run on three hits with no walks and seven strikeouts in his 2017 debut. Mississippi left-hander Max Fried (0-1) took the loss in an injury-shortened start, he allowed four runs (two earned) on four hits with three walks and two strikeouts in his inning and two-thirds of work. Jacksonville's first five runs all came with two outs. Taylor Ard opened the scoring with a two-RBI double in the top of the first to give the Jumbo Shrimp a 2-0 lead. Austin Dean followed in the second inning with a two-out, two-run triple to put Jacksonville's lead at 4-0. Fried would leave the game with left arm discomfort during the next at-bat. The Shrimp added to the lead with two outs in the fourth inning, as David Vidal supplied an RBI single to make it 5-0 Jacksonville.

Peters set down the first nine batters he faced during the first three innings, but Mississippi started the fourth inning with a single from Connor Lien. He was brought home two batters later by Travis Demeritte on an RBI double to cut Jacksonville's lead to 5-1. The Jumbo Shrimp plated another run in the top of the fifth when Alex Yarbrough reached on a fielder's choice / error by the shortstop to score John Norwood to put the lead to 6-1. Peters then worked a scoreless fifth inning to finish his time on the mound. The M-Braves scored their last run in the seventh inning on an RBI single by Kade Scivicque to make it a 6-2 ballgame. Jacksonville added its final run in the ninth on an RBI groundout by Ard to cap his three-RBI Double-A debut to put the score at 7-2, which would be the final. Tyler Higgins worked the final two innings for the Jumbo Shrimp on the mound in scoreless fashion to preserve the five-run victory.

NEWS AND NOTES

Peters Shines in 2017 Debut: Last night Marlins No. 5 prospect Dillon Peters shined for the Jumbo Shrimp, as the left-handed starter earned the victory in Jacksonville's Opening Night win in Mississippi. Peters worked five innings allowing run on three hits with no walks and seven strikeouts. His seven strikeouts set a Double-A High for the Indianapolis native, and was just one strikeout shy of matching his career-high of eight, which he set on May 20, 2016 with the High-A Jupiter Hammerheads against the Brevard County Manatees.

Ard Tied for SL RBI Lead: It may be just one game in, but Taylor Ard's 3-RBI performance has him tied for the Southern League lead in runs batted in. He is even with Biloxi's Angel Ortega, who collected three RBI in the Shuckers' 6-2 win over Montgomery on Thursday. Ard was making his Double-A debut for the Shrimp, and hit a two-out, two-RBI double to plate the first ever Jumbo Shrimp runs in the top of the first. Ard added to his night with an RBI groundout in the ninth inning that capped Jacksonville's scoring effort. Ard led Jupiter with 73 RBI in 130 games last season.

Ready to Manage: Randy Ready is in his first season as the Jumbo Shrimp manager in 2017. Last year was Ready's first in the Miami Marlins organization, and he led High-A Jupiter to a 68-69 record overall and a 37-32 mark in the second half of the Florida State League season. Ready's field staff features all newcomers to Jacksonville in hitting coach Jesus Merchan, pitching coach Storm Davis, and coach Jose Ceballos. A sixth-round draft pick in 1980 by the Milwaukee Brewers, Ready appeared in 777 big league games over parts of 13 Major League seasons with Milwaukee (1983-86), San Diego (1986-89), Philadelphia (1989-91, 1994-95), Oakland (1992) and Montreal (1993) while batting .259 with 40 home runs and 239 RBI.

Shrimp Have Prospects: On the Opening Day roster, the Jumbo Shrimp have seven players that are considered among the Top 30 Marlins prospects for this season according to both Baseball America and MLB.com. Top 30 Marlins Prospects include: third baseman Brian Anderson (No. 3 MLB, No. 4 BA), left-handed pitcher Jarlin Garcia (No. 4 MLB, No. 6 BA), left-handed pitcher Dillon Peters (No. 5 MLB, No. 5 BA), left fielder Austin Dean (No. 13 MLB, No. 8 BA), right-handed pitcher Tayron Guerrero (No. 19 MLB, No. 16 BA), outfielder John Norwood (No. 27 MLB, No. 29 BA), and infielder Yefri Perez (No. 30 both MLB & BA). Additionally, Baseball America regards Anderson as being the "Best Hitter for Average, Best Strike-Zone Discipline, Best Defensive Infielder, Best Infield Arm," in the organization, while Garcia has the "Best Changeup," Perez is the "Fastest Baserunner," and Peters has the "Best Control."

Facing the Braves: Last season Jacksonville went 9-11 against the Mississippi Braves. The then-Suns were 5-5 against the M-Braves at Trustmark Park, where tonight's series begins. Jacksonville took the first series in Mississippi in late May, winning three out of five games, before a series loss to the M-Braves in late June, where Mississippi won three out of five games. In Jacksonville, the club had a losing mark against Mississippi, going 4-6 against the M-Braves. Yefri Perez was one of the best Jacksonville players against the M-Braves, hitting .294 with seven RBI and nine stolen bases in 14 games. Dillon Peters also won his start against the M-Braves last year, and Matt Tomshaw turned in six innings where he only allowed a run on three hits against Mississippi last season.

TONIGHT – 2017 DEBUT: Tonight Matt Tomshaw makes his 2017 debut as he faces the Mississippi Braves at Trustmark Park in Pearl, Mississippi. Tomshaw was a non-roster invitee to Miami Marlins big league spring training, where he made three relief appearances.

2016 with JACKSONVILLE: Tomshaw had three stints with Jacksonville from May 30-June 20, June 22-July 30, and August 5 through the end of the season. With Jacksonville he was 4-4 with a 3.63 ERA in 15 appearances and 14 starts. He struck out at least six batters in his last five starts for Jacksonville, beginning with a season-high of 10 on August 12 vs. Mississippi.

2016 with NEW ORLEANS: Tomshaw was 0-1 with a 2.12 ERA in eight games in relief for the New Orleans Zephyrs, with his first five appearances coming in the month of May, and the final three in late July, early August. Tomshaw took his lone loss when he allowed a pair of runs in the 12th inning against the Colorado Springs Sky Sox on May 12. Tomshaw returned to the Zephyrs where he made an appearance June 21 allowing a hit with no walks with four strikeouts. Tomshaw in late July and August pitched for the Zephyrs in two relief outings on July 30 and August 3, turning in scoreless outings against the Nashville Sounds and Iowa Cubs.

2016 with JUPITER: After some time in extended spring training, Tomshaw earned the win in his lone appearance with the High-A Jupiter Hammerheads on May 1. He worked three scoreless innings, allowing a hit with a strikeout.

JU DOLPHIN: Tomshaw went to college locally at Jacksonville University. He continues to spend every offseason in the Jacksonville area while keeping in contact with JU manager Tim Montez. One of his proudest moments at JU was in a start against the University of Florida, who was ranked fourth at the time, whom he picked up an 11-2 victory in a rout of the Gators. Florida finished runners-up at that year's College World Series. The southpaw in his senior season also hurled a complete game five-hitter against East Tennessee in game one of the Atlantic Sun Conference tournament in a 2-1 victory.

Acquired by the Marlins in the 2014 Rule 5 draft from the Minnesota Twins

Originally drafted by the Twins in the 42nd round of the 2011 June First-Year Player Draft out of Jacksonville University.

2016 Highlights: Tomshaw had three stints with Jacksonville from May 30-June 20, June 22-July 30, and August 5 through the end of the season. With Jacksonville he was 4-4 with a 3.63 ERA in 15 appearances and 14 starts. 2015 Highlights: Spent the majority of his first season in the Marlins system with Double-A Jacksonville. Tomshaw went 6-10 with a 4.33 ERA in 20 appearances and 18 starts. Injured year s reliever: 1-1, 4.50 ERA in 11 G, started season as starter: 4-6, 5.35 ERA in 12 GS. Made two starts with Triple-A New Orleans in Mid-August, going 0-2 with a 17.18 ERA, allowing 15 runs (14 earned) in 7.1 IP.

2014 Highlights: He spent all of last year with advanced-A Fort Myers Miracle, going 11-6 with a 3.50 ERA in 25 games and 21 starts over 136.1 innings. On the campaign he set career highs for innings pitched (136.1) and tied his career high with 82 strikeouts. Tomshaw led the Miracle in wins (11), games started (21), and was second in total strikeouts (82).

2013 Highlights: He split 2013 with Fort Myers (A+) and Cedar Rapids (A-). With Fort Myers the southpaw posted a 4-4 mark to go along with a 3.94 ERA in 17 games and 14 starts over 96.0 innings. His 42 earned runs given up with FM were good for second-most he has allowed in a single stop. With CR, Tomshaw went 2-0 with a 5.10 ERA in nine games and four starts over 30.0 innings pitched. Batters hit .290 against Tomshaw at the low-A stop which was the worst of his career.

2012 Highlights: Tomshaw split 2012 between the GCL Twins and the Beloit Snappers (A). With GCL, he appeared in only two games and over his three innings pitched he allowed two hits. He spent the majority of the year with Beloit, going 4-6 attached to a 3.02 ERA in 20 games and 14 starts over 86.1 innings pitched. At the time that had been Tomshaw's first season with 20

2011 Highlights: After being drafted he had stops between the GCL Twins and Fort Myers. In his first year in rookie ball the southpaw mustered up a 3-0 record while pitching to a 2.16 ERA in 11 games over 16.2 innings. He would receive his first call up to Fort Myers and enter into the starting rotation setting a 2.13 ERA in seven games and four starts over 25.1 innings.

Personal: Tomshaw was drafted out of Jacksonville University, and in an interview with *twinsdaily.com* he highlighted some of his bright spots with JU. "One of my biggest wins was against University of Florida during the regular season at their stadium. They just came off taking two from Vanderbilt that weekend. At the time, Florida was ranked 4th in the nation, and we ended up beating them 11-2. After the College World Series was over and Florida finished 2nd only to South Carolina, did it hit me how big of a win that was. Also in my senior year in game 1 of the conference tournament against Eastern Tennessee State University, I threw a complete game allowing 5 hits, 1 unearned run and winning 2-1."
