## 2019 GWINNETT STRIPERS FINAL REPORT

## 80-59, International League South Champions / 1-3 in Governors' Cup Playoffs

2019 in Review: The Gwinnett Stripers posted the best winning percentage in club history in 2019, going 80-59 (.576) to win the International League South Division title for the second time in 11 seasons (first time since 2016). The Stripers finished second in the 14-team league in both wins (80) and winning percentage (.576), trailing eventual Governors' Cup champion Columbus (81-59, .579). The 80 wins were the secondmost ever by a Gwinnett club, trailing only the 2009 G-Braves (went 81-63, . 563 in a 144-game season).

- IL South Standings: Gwinnett finished 5.0 games ahead of both Durham (T-2 ${ }^{\text {nd }}, 75-64$, won IL Wild Card) and Charlotte (T$2^{\text {nd }}, 75-64$ ), and 20.0 games ahead of Norfolk ( $4^{\text {th }}, 60-79$ ).
- Postseason Clinchers: The Stripers clinched a playoff berth with a 14-8 win over Norfolk on $8 / 28$. The club officially clinched the IL South title on $8 / 30$ despite taking a 6-5 loss at Durham as Charlotte lost 2-0 at Norfolk. Gwinnett reached the Governors' Cup Playoffs for just the third time in club history (IL Wild Card in 2009, IL South champs in 2016)

Postseason Recap: In their first trip to the Governors' Cup Playoffs since 2016, the Stripers lost to the Columbus Clippers 3-1 in the best-of-five Semifinals. Gwinnett dropped Games 1 and 2 at Coolray Field (lost 5-4 and 7-3) and split Games 3 and 4 at Huntington Park (won 10-6, lost 5-4). The Stripers slugged seven home runs during the four-game series (1 each by Austin Riley, Adam Duvall, Ryan LaMarre, John Ryan Murphy, Cristian Pache, Pedro Florimon, and Jack Lopez), bu posted a 5.40 ERA (21 ER in 35.0 IP) as they were outscored 23-21. Kyle Wright (1-0, 3.00 ERA) and Bryse Wilson ( $0-0,4.50$ ERA) both turned in quality starts, while Pache led the club in batting (.417), doubles (2), extra-base hits (3), total bases (10), RBI (7), and slugging percentage (.833),

Berryhill is IL Manager of the Year: Damon Berryhill was named the 2019 IL Manager of the Year on 8/27, the second such award of his MiLB career (also won in the PCL in 2015). He is the first Gwinnett manager ever to win the award. The former Atlanta Braves catcher is the sixth skipper in Gwinnett history and has led the club to a 221-199 (.526) record in 420 games over three seasons (2017-current). He owns a career record of 639-586 (.522) in 1,225 games across 11 MiLB seasons, including stints with Advanced-A Bakersfield (Texas, 2008), Rookie-level Ogden (LA Dodgers, 200913), Triple-A Albuquerque (LAD, 2014), and Triple-A Oklahoma City (LAD, 2015).

Historic Homer Total: The Stripers hit 200 home runs over 139 games (1.44 HR/game) in 2019, the most ever in a season by an Atlanta Braves Triple-A affiliate (broke previous record of 161 HR set by Richmond in 1993). The club also set Gwinnett records for most homers in one month ( 61 HR in May, shattered previous record of 33 HR ) and most grand slams in one season (8, previous record was 7 in 2011). The Stripers ranked fourth in the IL in homers ( 13 behind Columbus, $1^{\text {st }}$ with 213 HR ), becoming just the ninth team in IL history to reach the 200-homer mark (1 of 4 teams this season). Twenty-one different Gwinnett hitters homered in 2019, led by Adam Duvall (32, $2^{\text {nd }}$ in IL) and Alex Jackson (career-high 28, T-5 $5^{\text {th }}$ in IL), who were both in the IL top 10.

20/20/20/20: For the first time in history, four Gwinnett players reached the 20-homer mark in the same season: Adam Duvall (32 HR), Alex Jackson (28 HR), Rafael Ortega (21 HR), and Travis Demeritte ( 20 HR ). Prior to 2019, Gwinnett hitters had reached the 20-homer mark just five times total in the team's 10-year history: Mauro Gomez in 2011 (24 HR), Stefan Gartrell in 2011 (25 HR) and 2012 (20 HR), and Ernesto Mejia in 2012 (24 HR) and 2013 (28 HR).

Record-Setting Season for Duvall: 2019 IL Postseason All-Star Adam Duvall set Gwinnett single-season records for home runs (32, breaking Ernesto Mejia's record of 28 HR in 2013), RBI (93, breaking Mejia's record of 92 RBI in 2012), slugging percentage (.602, breaking Mauro Gomez's record of .522 in 2011), and OPS (.966, breaking Barbaro Canizares' record of .907 in 2011). Across two stints with the Stripers, he batted . 266 ( 98 -for-369, 20 2B, 4 3B, 32 HR, 74 R, 93 RBI, 1 SB) in 101 games, and ranked among the IL top 10 in slugging percentage ( $1^{\text {st }}$, ), homers $\left(2^{\text {nd }}\right)$, RBI $\left(2^{\text {nd }}\right)$, OPS $\left(2^{\text {nd }}\right)$, extra-base hits ( $\mathrm{T}-6^{\text {th }}, 56$ ), and total bases ( $9^{\text {th }}, 222$ ). The Stripers went 24-5 (.828) in 29 games with a Duvall homer in 2019, including 3-0 in his multi-homer games.

Mound Mastery: Stripers pitchers led the 14 -team IL in ERA (4.29), WHIP (1.35), fewest runs allowed (641), fewest earned runs allowed (580), and fewest home runs allowed (134) in 2019...it's just the second time a Gwinnett club has led the circuit in ERA (3.33 ERA in 2011). The staff's most dominant run came in a 59-game stretch from 6/22-8/25, when the Stripers went an IL-best 37-22 (.627) with an IL-leading 3.89 ERA ( 222 ER in $\mathbf{5 1 3 . 0}$ IP). Starters went $24-14$ with a 3.83 ERA (128 ER in 301.0 IP) and 22 quality starts, while relievers went $13-8$ with a 3.99 ERA ( 94 ER in 212.0 IP) and 16 saves (16-for-19, 84.2\%) in that span. Patrick Weigel (6-0, 2.51 ERA in 11 games, 5 starts), Bryse Wilson (6-1, 2.38 ERA in 7 starts), and Kyle Wright (6-0, 2.62 ERA in 9 starts) combined to go 18-1 with a 2.51 ERA ( 36 ER in 129.0 IP) in 27 outings from 6/22-8/25.

The Bryse-Man Cometh: Bryse Wilson was named Gwinnett's 2019 Pitcher of the Year by the Braves after going 10-7 with an IL-best 3.42 ERA ( 46 ER in 121.0 IP ) and a team-high 11 quality starts in 21 starts for the Stripers. In addition to ERA, he ranked among the IL top 10 in WHIP ( $1^{\text {st }}, 1.21$ ), wins $\left(T-2^{\text {nd }}\right)$, BAA ( $3^{\text {rd }}, .256$ ), strikeouts $\left(7^{\text {th }}, 118\right)$, GO/AO ratio ( $8^{\text {th }}, 1.05$ ), and innings $\left(9^{\text {th }}\right)$. Wilson won each of his final six regular-season starts from 7/21-8/27, leading the IL in wins, ERA ( $0.90,4$ ER in 40.0 IP$)$, WHIP ( 0.95 ), and BAA (.214) in that span. He is just the second pitcher in Gwinnett history to win six consecutive starts, joining Kanekoa Texeira (6-0 from 7/20-8/15, 2015)

Ortega On Fire: The Braves named Rafael Ortega as Gwinnett's Player of the Year for 2019. Prior to having his contract selected by Atlanta on $8 / 13$, he batted .285 (123-for-431, 34 2B, 3 3B, 21 HR, 83 R, 58 RBI, 14 SB, 898 OPS) in 111 games with the Stripers, reaching base safely in 99 games ( $89.2 \%$ ) and scoring in 57 games (51.4\%). As of $8 / 13$, he ranked among IL leaders in runs $\left(1^{\text {st }}\right)$, doubles $\left(1^{\text {st }}\right)$, extra-base hits $\left(1^{\text {st }}, 58\right)$, total bases $\left(2^{\text {nd }}, 226\right)$, at-bats $\left(2^{\text {nd }}\right)$, games $\left(3^{\text {rd }}\right)$, hits $\left(5^{\text {th }}\right)$, and walks (T- $\left.6^{\text {th }}, 59\right)$. Ortega closed in on several Gwinnett single-season records, including doubles (was 1 shy of Freddie Freeman's 35 in 2010 and Ernesto Mejia's 35 in 2013), walks (was 3 shy of Wes Timmons' 62 in 2009), runs (was 5 shy of Matt Young's 88 in 2010), and total bases (was 38 shy of Mauro Gomez's 264 in 2011).

The Wright Stuff: Kyle Wright led the IL with 11 wins in 2019, the most by a Gwinnett pitcher since LHP Andrew Albers went 12-3 over 26 games in 2017. Wright went 11-4 with a 4.17 ERA ( 52 ER in 112.1 IP0 and 10 quality starts in 21 starts (team went 15-6, .714) with the Stripers, also ranking among the IL top 10 in BAA ( $\mathrm{T}-1^{\text {st }}, .252$ ), WHIP $\left(2^{\text {nd }}, 1.26\right)$, ERA $\left(5^{\text {th }}\right)$, GO/AO ratio ( $\left.\mathrm{T}-5^{\text {th }}, 1.24\right)$, and strikeouts $\left(9^{\text {th }}, 116\right)$. Over his last 12 starts with Gwinnett from 6/14-8/31, he led the IL in wins (8) and strikeouts (86), going a perfect 8-0 with a 2.57 ERA (21 ER in 73.2 IP), 1.14 WHIP, and . 230 BAA.

Kaz Climbing Career Lists: Over seven seasons with Gwinnett (2013-19), Sean Kazmar Jr. is batting . 268 (620-for-2,310, 127 2B, 12 3B, 37 HR, 279 R, 270 RBI, 23 SB) in 667 games. His 620 hits are fourth-most by an Atlanta Braves Triple-A player (Richmond/Gwinnett combined), ahead of Chico Ruiz (606 hits from 1973-74, 1976-84) and trailing only Larry Whisenton (657 hits from 197681, 1983-85), Damon Hollins (648 hits from 1996-98, 2001-04), and Paul Runge (642 hits from 1981-84, 1986-87).

LaMarre Locked In: Ryan LaMarre batted . 354 (64-for-181, 11 2B, 4 3B, 5 HR, 33 R, 24 RBI, 11 SB, .974 OPS) over his final 51 games with the Stripers in 2019. He finished the year on a 35-game on-base streak, the third-longest in the IL this season (.351, 46-for-131, 7 2B, $13 \mathrm{~B}, 4 \mathrm{HR}, 25 \mathrm{R}, 18 \mathrm{RBI}, 14 \mathrm{BB}$, .427 OBP). In 112 total games, LaMarre hit . 311 (126-for-405, 24 2B, 8 3B, 9 HR, $55 \mathrm{R}, 53 \mathrm{RBI}, 19 \mathrm{SB}, .857 \mathrm{OPS}$ ), ranking among the IL top 10 in triples (T$\left.1^{\text {st }}\right)$, batting $\left(7^{\text {th }}\right)$, on-base percentage $\left(9^{\text {th }}, .380\right)$, and stolen bases $\left(T-9^{\text {th }}\right)$. His eight triples tied the Gwinnett single-season record (Ozzie Albies, 8 in 2017).
"Break"-ing Out: Pedro Florimon led the IL in batting after the Triple-A AllStar Break, hitting . 338 (51-for-151, 6 2B, 2 3B, 8 HR, 28 R, 40 RBI, 1 SB) in 45 games. He also ranked among the IL top 10 in on-base percentage ( $3^{\text {rd }}, .437$ ), walks (T-3 $\left.{ }^{\text {rd }}, 29\right)$, RBI $\left(4^{\text {th }}\right)$, OPS $\left(4^{\text {th }}, 1.000\right)$, and slugging percentage $\left(9^{\text {th }}, .563\right)$ in that span. Alex Jackson ranked third in the IL in home runs after the Triple-A All-Star Break with 13, batting . 252 (30-for-119, 4 2B, 22 R, 32 RBI, 1 SB, .931 OPS) in 31 games in that span.

Talented Tandem: Atlanta's No. 1 and 2 prospects, 20-year-olds Cristian Pache and Drew Waters, both made their Triple-A debuts with Gwinnett in 2019. Pache reached base safely in 23 of 26 games (.274, 26-for-95, 8 2B, 1 3B, 1 HR, 13 R, 8 RBI, 9 BB ), while Waters reached base safely in 24 of 26 games (.271, 29-for-107, 5 2B, 2 HR, 17 R, 11 RBI, 3 SB, 11 BB). In 134 total games between Mississippi and Gwinnett, Waters ranked among the MiLB top 10 in doubles (T$\left.3^{\text {rd }}, 40\right)$, hits $\left(5^{\text {th }}, 163\right)$, at-bats $\left(6^{\text {th }}, 527\right)$, and games $\left(T-7^{\text {th }}\right)$.

You Don't Mess with the Johan: Optioned to Gwinnett by Atlanta on 8/16, Johan Camargo hit safely in 13 of 14 games with the Stripers, batting an IL-best . 483 (28-for-58, 6 2B, 2 HR, 10 R, 15 RBI, 1.221 OPS) from 8/16-8/31. He posted five straight multi-hit games from $8 / 24-8 / 28$, tied for the longest multihit game streak by a Striper in 2019 (Jack Lopez, 5G, 6/16-6/21). In 55 career games with Gwinnett (2017-19), Camargo has batted . 345 (76-for-242, 17 2B, 1 3B, 9 HR, 33 R, 42 RBI, 1 SB, . 949 OPS). He hit safely in 16 consecutive games with the club from 4/16/18 to 8/30/19 (.515, 35-for-68, 8 2B, 2 HR, 12 R, 19 RBI).

Honoring "Mo" in 2019: The Stripers wore a "JM" sleeve patch to honor former coach Jose Mota, who passed away at age 53 on 11/6/18. Mota spent 22 seasons as a Braves' MiLB coach, four with Gwinnett (2014, 2016-18).
