Dayton Dragons (23-32, 51-74) at Lansing Lugnuts (29-26, 61-63)

RH Adrian Rodriguez (5-2, 3.67) vs. RH Fitz Stadler (4-6, 4.84)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Lansing Lugnuts (affiliate of the Toronto Blue Jays) in the third game of a four-game series.

2019 Season Series between Dayton and Lansing: Lugnuts 10, Dragons 5 (at Lansing: Lugnuts 3, Dragons 2).

Last Game: Sunday: Lansing 9, Dayton 6. The Lugnuts erased a 4-1 Dragons lead with six runs in the bottom of the seventh inning on the way to evening the series at one win apiece. It was a tough day for the Dayton bullpen, which combined to work two and one-third innings while allowing eight runs. The Dragons had 12 hits and were led by Michael Siani (3 for 5, HR, 3 RBI, SB). Matt Lloyd, Cameron Warren, and Randy Ventura each had two hits for Dayton. Starting pitcher Clate Schmidt was brilliant for the Dragons as a late addition to the lineup, allowing just one run in five and two-thirds innings while retiring the last 10 batters he faced.

Team Notes

- The Dragons collected 12 hits on Sunday, their highest total in a game since they had 12 on July 31. They have scored at least six runs in back-to-back games for the first time since July 30-31.
- The Dragons are 2-3 on the current seven-game road trip, posting a 2.60 ERA with an opponent batting average of .202, but they have allowed seven unearned runs. In two of the five games, Dragons pitchers have not allowed a run over the first nine innings. The Dragons are batting .227 on the trip while scoring 18 runs (3.6 runs per game).
- The Dragons are 7-18 (.389) with men in scoring position in the current series at Lansing. They went 6-48 (.125) in those situations in the last two series combined (vs. Lansing; at Bowling Green).
- The Dragons have lost nine of their last 12 games. **Over those 12 games**, the Dragons are batting .225, averaging 3.33 runs per game, with a team ERA of 3.74 while allowing 13 unearned runs.
- Dragons rankings within the MWL **in the 2nd Half:** Batting Average: .239, 11th; Runs: 201, 15th; Home Runs: 27, 12th; Stolen Bases: 37, 13th; Earned Run Average: 3.84, 10th; Total Runs Allowed: 244, 10th.
- The Dragons have lost 11 games after leading by at least three runs. They have lost two games in which they led by four runs, and two games after a five-run lead.

Individual Notes

- **Morgan Lofstrom** over his last nine games is batting .367 with one home run and eight runs batted in.
- **Miguel Hernandez** is 5 for 15 (.33) with a double and triple on the current road trip (5 games).
- **Michael Siani** in the current series is 4 for 9 with a home run and double.
- **Matt Pidich** over his last 26 games: 1.39 ERA, 45.1 IP, 29 H, 15 R, 7 ER, 14 BB, 50 SO.
- **Eddy Demurias** over his last three games: 0.00 ERA, 8 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 6 SO.
- **Matt Lloyd** hit a three-run home run in his first swing of his first game with the Dragons on August 9, becoming the second Dragons player this season to hit a homer in his first game with the club (Jay Schuyler on Opening Night). Lloyd started his pro career at Billings earlier this summer by hitting home runs in his second, third, and fourth games with the team. He was a 1st Team All-Big Ten choice at Indiana in both 2018 and 2019 and also served as the Hoosiers closer on the mound.

*The Dragons enjoyed a 10-game winning streak from June 2-12. This winning streak tied for the second longest in franchise history and was the longest since 2007. During the winning streak, the Dragons outscored their opponents 55-30. During the streak, they led the league in team batting (.276) and team ERA (2.10). They were tied for third in runs scored (55). They were second in the league in stolen bases (21).

***B-Rey Bombs:** Dragons outfielder Brian Rey broke the club record for most RBI in a game on July 27 at Fort Wayne, driving in eight runs. He hit two home runs including a grand slam and also contributed a three-run double. The previous record of seven RBI was held by four players including Joey Votto and Adam Dunn. Rey had matched the record by the end of the second inning and broke it in the fourth with a solo homer.

*Four members of the Dragons are rated among the Reds top 30 prospects (*Baseball America*). They are OF **Michael Siani** (#7); OF **Mariel Bautista** (#16); RHP **Lyon Richardson** (#17); 3B **Juan Martinez** (#22). Additionally, SS **Miguel Hernandez** is ranked #25 by *Fangraphs.com*.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Luis Bolívar returns for his third season as Dragons manager after serving as the Dayton hitting coach in 2014-16. Bolívar played for the Dragons in 2003-'04, representing the club in the Midwest League All-Star Game in 2004. Bolívar played professionally for nine seasons from 2002-2010, spending all but the final year of his career in the Reds organization. He spent all or parts of four seasons at the Triple-A level, but never played in the big leagues. Bolívar resides in the Dayton suburb of Vandalia with his wife and four children. Following his playing career, he served as a coach at Vandalia-Butler High School. Bolívar was selected as the "Best Manager Prospect" in *Baseball America's* 2017 Best Tools survey of Midwest League managers.

Pitching coach **Seth Etherton** returns to the Dragons for his second season in 2019, his fourth year as a coach in the Reds organization. Etherton spent the 2016-17 seasons with the Billings Mustangs. Etherton pitched in the Major Leagues in parts of four seasons with the Angels, Reds, A's, and Royals. He was the Angels first round draft pick in 1998 out of the University of Southern California. Etherton pitched in one game for the Dragons on a Major League rehab assignment in 2002.

Hitting coach **Mike Devereaux** joins the Dragons in 2019, his second year as a coach in the Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach for Double-A Pensacola in 2018. Previously, he was a coach for six years in the Rockies organization after two years in the Orioles system. Devereaux spent 12 years in the Major Leagues with the Orioles, Dodgers, Braves, White Sox, and Rangers. He was the MVP of the 1995 NLCS with Atlanta. In 1992 with Baltimore, he hit 24 home runs and drove in 107 runs, finishing seventh in the AL MVP voting.

Bench coach **Kevin Mahar** returns to the Dragons for his third season and sixth year as a coach in the Reds organization. He spent the 2013-14 seasons at Billings and 2015 at Advanced-A Daytona. He worked in private business in 2016. Mahar played college baseball at Indiana University and reached the Major Leagues with the Texas Rangers in 2007.

DRAGONS 2019 HIGHLIGHTS

Manzanero Trio: On April 23 at Lake County, Pabel Manzanero became the fourth player in Dragons history to hit three home runs in one game, and the first to do it in 10 years. Manzanero's three-homer matched the feats of Wily Mo Pena (2001), Juan Francisco (2007) and Byron Wiley (2009). Manzanero hit a two-run home run in the first inning and added solo homers in the fifth and seventh, going 3 for 5.

Team Cycle: The Dragons hit for the cycle as a team in the sixth inning vs. Great Lakes at Fifth Third Field on April 25. The inning included home runs by Jonathan Willems and Shard Munroe, a single by Morgan Lofstrom, a double by Reniel Ozuna, and a triple by Jay Schuyler, the final hit of the inning. The Dragons scored four runs in the inning and won the game, 8-3.

The Winning Streak: The Dragons enjoyed a 10-game winning streak from June 2-12. This winning streak tied for the second longest in franchise history and was the longest since 2007. The club record is 13 straight wins in 2002. During the winning streak, the Dragons outscored their opponents 55-30. During the streak, they led the league in team batting (.276) and team ERA (2.10). They were tied for third in runs scored (55). They were second in the league in stolen bases (21). They were third in in doubles (16). They ranked first in both holds (7), and saves (7).

The Comebacks: On July 8, the Dragons trailed South Bend 4-1 with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning. Dayton rallied to win the game, getting an RBI single from Michael Siani to make it 4-2, a two-run single by Bren Spillane to tie the score, and an RBI single by Pabel Manzanero to win it. The hits by both Spillane and Manzanero came with two strikes. The game marked the first time since July 18, 2013 that the Dragons won a game in the bottom of the ninth inning despite trailing by at least three runs to start the half-inning. On July 18, 2013, they trailed Beloit 6-3 going to the bottom of the ninth and won on Seth Mejias-Brean's walk-off grand slam with one out, 7-6.

On July 14, the Dragons trailed Beloit 5-0 after one-half inning. They eventually rallied to win the game 8-6, taking the lead in the bottom of the sixth on a three-run triple by Pabel Manzanero. It was the first time the Dragons came back to win a game that they had trailed by as many as five runs since July 27, 2018 when they erased a five-run deficit to defeat Fort Wayne.

Big Start: On July 27 at Fort Wayne, the Dragons scored six runs before the first out was recorded in the top of the first inning, establishing a new season high for runs in the first. They then added seven more runs in the second inning to take a 13-0 lead. They sent 20 batters to the plate in the first two innings. They won the game 14-7 (see Brian Rey record-breaking performance below).

B-Rey Bombs: On July 27 at Fort Wayne, Dragons outfielder Brian Rey broke a club record by driving in eight runs in a game. He hit a grand slam home run in the first inning, added a three-run double in the second, and belted a solo homer in the fourth. Rey broke the record of four RBI in a game held by four players including Adam Dunn and Joey Votto.

The Catch: On July 30, Dragons center fielder Michael Siani made a tremendous leaping/diving catch vs. Bowling Green at Fifth Third Field. The catch was featured that night as the #3 play on ESPN's Top 10 Plays of the Day. By 1:00 p.m. on August 1, the video replay of the catch on the Dragons Twitter page had been viewed by over 72,000 people.

Back-to-Back Walk-Offs: The Dragons notched walk-off wins on consecutive nights on July 31-August 1 against Bowling Green at Fifth Third Field. On July 31, Brian Rey's one-out double in the bottom of the ninth brought in Mariel Bautista from second base. The next night, Bautista doubled with one out in the bottom of the ninth to bring in Nate Scantlin from first.

First Time Ever: Eddy Demurias became the first pitcher in Dragons history to bat and score a run in the same game August 14 at Bowling Green. Demurias entered the game in the 10th inning as a pinch runner and batted in the 12th, reaching on a fielder's choice and later scoring. The last Dragons pitcher to bat was Nick Travieso in 2014.
