RAILRIDERS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 20-10 | AWAY: 18-16 | STREAK: W 1 | LAST 5: 3-2 | LAST 10: 6-4

LAST TIME OUT: The RailRiders got a stellar performance from **Domingo Acevedo** in his Triple-A debut and routed the host Buffalo Bisons on Friday night, 8-1. The RailRiders won for the fifth time in seven games.

THE D.A.: During that time, Acevedo (1-0) amassed seven innings of three-hit, one-run ball for the victory. His greatest challenge came in the fifth. With two out, Ian Parmley doubled and then scored on former RailRider Gregorio Petit's single. Successive walks to Rowdy Tellez and Mike Ohlman loaded the bases. But facing longtime Major League veteran Jarrod Saltalamacchia, Acevedo induced a fly-out to center field to end the inning. That sparked a surge of seven straight Bisons retired to end his outing.

RED THUNDER: After blasting a three-run homer to left last night, **Clint Frazier** lifted his team-best totals of homers to 12 and RBIs to 38. He also has drawn a team-high 32 walks. Frazier ranks among the IL's best in doubles (2nd, 18), extra-base hits (3rd, 30) and runs scored (T-4th, 41). Over his last eight games, Frazier has gone 11-for-32 with five extra-base hits, eight RBIs, six steals in as many tries and eight runs scored, slashing .344/.405/.688/1.093.

DEADPOOL: **Tyler Wade** stretched the IL's best active hitting streak to 15 games last night. During his hot run, he has gone 26-for-64 (.406) with seven extra-base hits, eight RBIs, five walks (.437 OBP) and 15 runs scored. His 16 steals have him one off the pace of Gwynnett's Ozzie Albies for tops in Triple-A. Wade is on pace to post 35 steals this season. The franchise's single-season record of 44 was set by **Tommy Barrett** in 1989. Wade ranks among the IL's best in; batting average (2nd, .317), hits (1st, 80) and runs scored (1st, 49). He made his first career start in center field on May 8 at Pawtucket and got his first nod in right field on May 16 vs. the Paw Sox. He had no outfield experience and just one start at third base in regular-season play entering 2017. On April 29, May 6, 14, 21, 29, June 14 and 15 he drew starts at the hot corner and first tasted the outfield with an April 30 nod in left. His first-ever outfield time came in the 2016 Arizona Fall League when he started 16 of his 18 games played in the outfield (5-RF, 4-LF, 7-CF).

FOWL BALL: **Dustin Fowler** ranks among the IL's best in hits (3rd, 75), slugging percentage (4th, .541), extra-base hits (T-1st, 35), doubles (T-3rd, 17), triples (1st, 8) and total bases (1st, 138). His eight triples tie him for third in all of MiLB with two others including Advanced-A Tampa's **Jorge Mateo**. Advanced-A Lynchburg's Sam Haggerty leads the minors with 10 triples. Fowler is on pace to triple 18 times. The single-season franchise record is 16, set by **Shane Victorino** during his 2005 IL MVP campaign.

GLEYSBERMANIA: Entering play on June 5, **Gleyber Torres** had gone 7-for-36 (.194) over his first 11 Triple-A games with 13 strikeouts, one extra-base hit and three RBIs. In 11 games played since, he has gone 17-for-43 (.395) with two doubles, a triple, two homers and 13 RBIs. That includes a career-high-tying four RBIs during his 3-for-3 effort with a go-ahead three-run homer to deep left-center field in the June 5 win at Rochester's Frontier Field and a two-run shot to straight-away center at Lehigh Valley June 9.

SWIPER, NO SWIPING!: SWB leads the IL in caught-stealing efficiency at 49% (23 of 47 caught). **Eddy Rodriguez** stands as the IL's top catcher in the category. With Rodriguez behind the plate SWB has nabbed 12 men in 23 attempts (52%). The IL's average caught-stealing efficiency minus SWB stands at 32%.

YOUNG GUNS: Wade, Fowler and Frazier are all 22 years old. Torres is just 20 years of age and the IL's second-youngest position player. The IL's mean-average age for position players early this season stands a shade under 27. SWB stands tied for the IL's youngest group of position players with Durham at 24.8.

THE OFFENSIVE: SWB's offense ranks among the IL's best in: R/G (1st, 4.88), AVG (1st, .272), OBP (1st, .341), SLG (1st, .434), OPS (1st, .775), 2B (1st, 145), 3B (T-2nd, 16), HR (4th, 59) and SB (3rd, 58).

OFF THE RAILS: **Gleyber Torres** went 3-for-4 with a double, a walk and a run scored...**Donovan Solano** singled and walked, extending his hitting streak to 13 games, hitting .360 in that time...**Tyler Austin** went 2-for-4 with his first triple of the year...Austin has posted multiple hits in five of his last seven games, going 11-for-29 with six extra-base hits, slashing .379/.438/.621/1.058...**Tyler Wade** enjoyed a 2-for-4 night with an RBI double, a walk and three runs scored...In his first game as a RailRider, southpaw **Tommy Layne** tossed 1.2 scoreless and hitless innings, walking one and whiffing two...Buffalo pitching struck out 13 including 10 by starter Luis Santos (2-6) who became the fourth different opposing starter to whiff double-digit RailRiders in an outing.

ON THE BUMP: **Chance Adams** was dubbed NYY's 8th-best prospect by *Baseball America* after '16 when he went a combined 13-1, 2.33 between A+/AA while leading all full-season MiLB starters in BAA (.169). He left AA this year 4-0, pacing the EL in ERA (1.03). He tossed seven-plus innings for the first time this season and third time on his short starting career in his final AA start May 8 at Akron (7IP, 8H, 2R, 2BB, 5K, 1HR - Win). He won his AAA debut at SYR May 14 (5IP, 2H, 0R, 3BB, 6K - 97P/57S) and dominated in a May 31 win vs. COL (6IP, 1H, 0R, 2BB, CH 12K). Since he debuted, Adams ranks among the IL's best in ERA (7th), WHIP (1st 0.84), BAA (1st, .151) and K (3rd, 40).

An ARI 15th-rd'er in '10 out of the Univ. of Ark., **Mike Bolsinger** has since been traded twice: to LAD for cash in Nov. '14 and to TOR Aug. 1 '16 for RHP Jesse Chavez. He has MLB time w/all 3 orgs: 42G/41S, 8-18, 4.73, .275, 1.49). He began '17 in BUF's pen, a run of 4G/2GS that inc. a loss in relief at SWB on Apr. 16 (2.2IP, 5H, 2R, 0BB, 4K). TOR called him up for 5GS in a row from May 9-31, going 0-2, 5.61, .273, 1.79. He has since tossed twice in relief for BUF, inc. a June 10 win at PAW (2IP, 1H, 0R, 0BB, 0K). Tonight marks his first IL nod since Apr. 27. He has dominated IL RHH (.148/.207/.259) but has struggled w/LHH (.300/.323/.400).

SOUTH OF THE BORDER: Buffalo has fielded a Triple-A baseball team since 1985. It was the top satellite of the White Sox from 1985-86, the Indians in 1987 and the Pirates from 1988-94 before it switched back to the Indians (1995-08). In 2009, the Bisons claimed an Empire State squad as their parent club in the Mets. But change came calling again as 2013 marked the first season that the closest Major League city sent its top minor leaguers to Buffalo. In April 2016, the Blue Jays renewed their PDC with the Bisons through the 2018 season. Rogers Centre, home of the Blue Jays, is just a 90-minute drive from Coca-Cola Field (not including customs-related delays).

CALLING THE SHOTS: First-year Buffalo skipper **Bobby Meacham** spent his entire six-year playing career in the bigs with the New York Yankees (1983-88). He slashed .236/.313/.308/.621 over 457 career games and 1,591 plate appearances. His lone season with over 400 at-bats came in 1985 when he slashed .218/.302/.266/.568 as the team's primary shortstop and by far led the bigs with 23 sacrifice hits. His teammate, **Don Mattingly**, claimed A.L. MVP honors as the Yankees won 97 games for the junior circuit's second-best record, but fell 2.0 games shy of the first-place Toronto Blue Jays for the A.L. East crown. It made for Toronto's first division title. The Yankees hadn't won a division crown since 1981 and would not win another until 1996. Two big pieces of that 1996 team spent time with those 1985 Blue Jays, **Cecil Fielder** and **Jimmy Key**. Also, one of Toronto's catchers that season, who saw time in just 14 games in his final season as a big league player? Meacham's predecessor as Buffalo manager, **Gary Allenson**.
